Temporary Parking Restrictions on Bennington Heights Drive and other Local Roads

Expected Start Date: June 5, 2025
Expected End Date: June 6, 2025
Timeline is approximate

The City of Toronto has completed the mainline sewer upgrade of the area's storm and sanitary sewer system to reduce surface and basement flooding. The next stage of construction involves roadway restoration. Road restoration is a two-step process with grinding completed on all streets first, followed by paving. Typically, this work is done sequentially and as such, please note that work can begin at any time during the work hours of 7:00 am – 7:00 pm.

To complete the road grinding work, **on-street parking will be restricted from June 5, 2025, to June 6, 2025**, on the following streets:

- **Bennington Heights Drive**, from the **intersection of Bayview Heights Drive and Bennington Heights Drive** (near 61 Bennington Heights Dr.) to the **intersection of Heath Street East and Bennington Heights Drive** (near 432 Heath St. E)
- **Moore Hill Drive**, from **4 Moore Hill Drive to the intersection of Moore Hill Drive and Bennington Heights Drive**
- **Heath Street East**, from the **intersection of Heath Street East and Bennington Heights Drive to 407 Heath Street East**
- **Lumley Avenue**, from **2 Lumley Avenue to 16 Lumley Avenue**
- **Burnham Road** (entire street)
- **Brendan Road** (entire street)

. This timeline is weather dependent and is subject to change.

PARKING VIOLATION NOTICES

Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times. If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:



1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) **or**
2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction.

Note: Parking violation notices cannot be cancelled for offences such as parking in front of a fire hydrant, parking or stopping on sidewalks or boulevards, parking in fire routes, accessible loading zones, No Parking or No Stopping zones, or parking in violation of rush hour restrictions.
