Overnight Paving on Dufferin Street from Dupont Street to south of Shanly Street

Contract: 24ECS-RD-05MR
Start Date: June 16 from 7 p.m.
End Date: June 20 at 9 p.m.
*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto's work on Dufferin Street, Millicent Street and Hallam Street continues to progress well. This notice provides an update on paving operations.

The City's contractor plans to complete one night of top-asphalt paving between Monday, June 16th from 7 p.m. and Friday, June 20th, at 9 p.m., the dates are tentative and subject to change.

Paving operations are being completed at night to minimize daytime disruptions and reduce the impacts to traffic congestion, especially during peak hours, as well as expedite the schedule of projects in the downtown core. Pavement markings will be installed after paving has been completed.

The Contractor is permitted to work 24 hours a day until the work can be completed.

Once the overnight work is finished, regular work hours will resume. Your patience and understanding are greatly appreciated during this disruption.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

 You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.



Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.



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Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.

Traffic on Dufferin Street will be reduced to one lane each direction.



Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.



Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:

- 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or
- 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction.

If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.

Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).

In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
