

TTC Streetcar Track Renewal at King Street & Dufferin Street Intersection

Contract: 25ECS-RD-02SW

Start Date: Early September 2025 End Date: Mid-October 2025 *Dates subject to change. More details will be provided in a future notice.

The City of Toronto and the Toronto Transit Commission (TTC) plan to renew aging streetcar tracks at King Street and Dufferin Street intersection in 2025.

This work is required to bring City infrastructure to a state of good repair and is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program.

CONSTRUCTION PHASES

September 2025 to October 2025. Crews will install new streetcar track at the intersection of King Street and Dufferin Street. TTC crews will test the newly constructed tracks. Crews will also complete sidewalk replacement and tactile plate installation.	•	The intersection will be fully closed to vehicles and cyclists. TTC bus and streetcar service will detour around the intersection. See page 2. Temporary sidewalk closures may be required. Pedestrian detours and signage will be in place. Access to businesses and properties will be maintained.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Before construction begins, work crews will use spray paint to mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water, and cable, so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
 Any affected properties will receive a Construction Nation approximately two works before work begins
- Any affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins, with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Work Hours: Work will take place 24 hours, 7 days a week. Excavation activities and heavy breaking will be carried out at various times throughout the day. All concrete breaking activities will occur between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. Concrete breaking work is the most disruptive and will typically last the first 1-2 days for each phase of construction. Around-the-clock work during rail installation by TTC is required to preserve the integrity and quality of new rail and concrete. Overnight rail work by TTC may consist of moving new rail into position, rail installation and rail welding/grinding.

B R R R R R R R R R R R R R R R R R R R	Access to Your Property: The City-hired contractor may need access to the interior and exterior of your property to complete a pre-construction condition survey. Affected properties will receive a letter with a request to schedule the pre-construction condition survey. Although participation is voluntary, the pre-construction survey results may be useful to confirm claims for potential damage caused by City construction.
8	 Traffic Management: Efforts will be made to manage traffic and closures in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets during this project. During the work there will be a full closure of King Street and Dufferin Street intersection to vehicular traffic. 	 TTC Service: From September 2 to October 11, 2025, the following streetcar/bus routes will divert due to the King Street West and Dufferin Street intersection closure: 503 Kingston Rd – A 503 Kingston Rd bus replacement will be introduced, operating between King Street West at Joe Shuster Way, and Kingston Road at Victoria Park Avenue. 504 King and 508 Lake Shore – 504A King and 508 Lake Shore streetcars will divert via Queen Street West between Shaw Street and Roncesvalles Avenue. 504B King streetcars will be shortened to Bathurst Street. 29 Dufferin – 29 Dufferin buses will divert to King Street West at Joe Shuster Way via Queen Street West and Shaw Street. 929 Dufferin Express – 929 Dufferin Express buses will be shortened to Queen Street West. 402 Parkdale Community bus – service will remain unaffected and continue to provide limited service within South Parkdale, operating on regular routing, during the construction. If you have a mobility challenge, TTC encourages you to apply for temporary WheelTrans service to safely and reliably get around during the intersection closure. き、	 Road and Sidewalk Access: To ensure the work is completed safely, road and sidewalk restrictions will be in effect within the construction work area. Please watch for signs directing pedestrians. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Laneways: Laneways and driveways that serve businesses in the area will remain accessible for deliveries or services.
Ġ	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need, or a related accommodation request, please contact us at the information listed below.
	Deliveries: Businesses may want to consider adjusting delivery times as a result of the traffic restrictions during this project.
OPEN	King Street and Dufferin Street businesses will be open throughout construction. All are welcome to dine and shop.
