Basement Flooding Protection Program Partial Road Closure on St. Clair Avenue East And Squires Avenue

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary sewer systems in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. As part of the planned work, the City will be completing sanitary sewer installation work at the intersection of St. Clair Avenue East and Squires Avenue, beginning on Thursday, July 24, 2025, and continuing through Tuesday, July 29, 2025. Construction will occur during the hours from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday.

A flagger will be present to assist with pedestrian crossings, and a Paid Duty Officer will be on site during the work. We apologize in advance for the inconvenience.

WORK DETAILS

The contractor will:

- Complete sanitary sewer installations.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise, and traffic delays.
- No left turn from Squires Avenue onto St. Clair Avenue East.
- Right turns only permitted from Squires Avenue onto St. Clair Avenue East.
- No access to Squires Avenue from St. Clair Avenue East.
- Detour in place via Plaxton Drive through Lane S (St. Clair E → Plaxton Dr.).
- Traffic signs and detour markers will be posted to guide drivers safely around the work zone.

The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.
