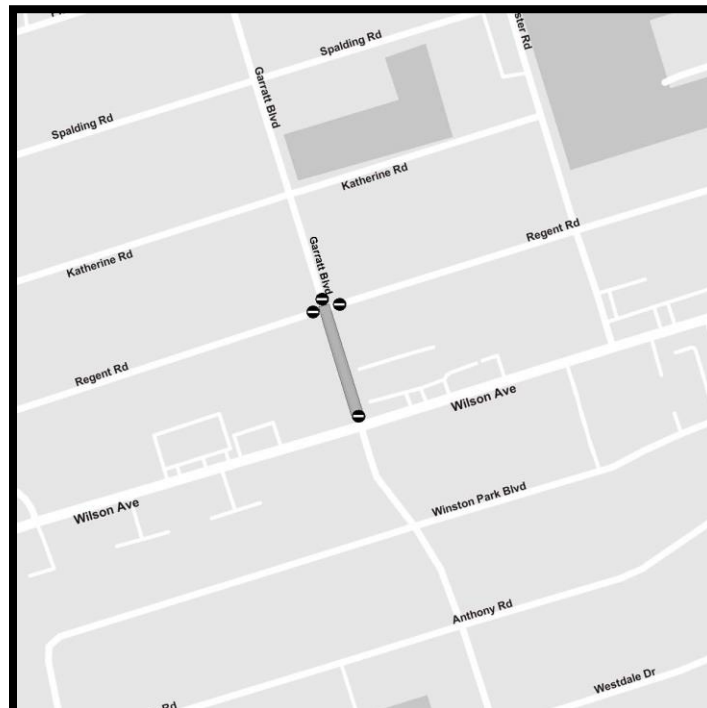
## Intersection Closure at Garratt Boulevard and Regent Road

**Contract: 21ECS-LU-04FP**  
**Expected Start Date: July 30, 2025**  
**Expected End Date: August 8, 2025**

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the construction work on Garratt Boulevard, the **road will be closed at the intersection of Garratt Boulevard and Regent Road effective from 7:00 a.m. on Wednesday, July 30, 2025, to 7:00 p.m. on Friday, August 8, 2025.**

This project is part of the Council-approved Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our ageing infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

## WORK DETAILS

For this project, the contractor will:

- Excavate on Garratt Boulevard at Regent Road to install the sanitary sewer and watermain and restore the area.
- This work will require temporary closure on Garratt Boulevard and Regent Road to all traffic.
- Residents living on Garratt Boulevard will continue to have access and use of their driveways during this construction period.
- During construction, the closure will be limited to Garratt Boulevard between Wilson Avenue and Regent Road intersection. All nearby roads will remain open and available for detours, including Wilson Avenue, Murray Road, Ancaster Road, etc.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p>
	<p><b>Pedestrians:</b> The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions; however, any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.</p>
	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
