

MATERIALS

Materials are not included in adult course fees. Please inquire at the Cedar Ridge Office or with your instructor for supply lists. Pottery students must purchase clay from Cedar Ridge Creative Centre, which includes glazing, firing and technician costs, \$45 per bag. Outside clay or old clay is not permitted and pottery tools are not provided. Students must bring their own tools or purchase them from Cedar Ridge.



POTTERY & CLAY COURSES



POTTERY: BEGINNER

Learn basic wheel techniques and how to use pottery tools and equipment like slab rollers. This course introduces students to greenware, bisqueware and glazeware processes from clay to pot as well as reclaiming techniques.

POTTERY: INTERMEDIATE

Refine techniques learned in beginner courses and improve your throwing and hand-building skills. Explore more complex forms and learn to make repetitive shapes. Gain basic knowledge of the kiln firing process and different glazing techniques with increased one-on-one attention from your instructor. This is a course for potters with intermediate/advanced skills. It is not designed for beginner students. Students should be able to competently centre and throw a 2-lb cylinder or hand-build a 4-to-6-inch piece.

POTTERY: ADVANCED

Harness the pottery techniques covered in beginner and intermediate courses and improve your skills with more complex wheel work, hand-building and glazing. Learn the art of self-critique and discover how to advance your artistic practice. This is a course for potters with intermediate/advanced skills. It is not designed for beginner-level students. Students should be able to competently centre and throw a 3-lb cylinder or hand-build a 6-inch piece.

WHEEL WORK: INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCED

Hone your wheel throwing talents through demonstration and individual instruction and discover how to shape forms from previously wheel thrown parts. Learn to critique clay forms and improve your technique independently. This is a course for potters with intermediate/advanced skills. It is not designed for beginner-level students. Students should be able to competently centre and throw a 2-lb cylinder.



ADVANCED EXPLORATIONS IN POTTERY

Explore and discover your personal style as a potter in this advanced level class for independent learners. Through individualized challenging projects, take your advanced clay working skills to the next level while growing as a potter. This is a course for potters with advanced skills. It is not designed for beginner or intermediate-level students. Students should be able to competently centre and throw a 3-lb cylinder or hand-build a 6-inch piece.

SCULPTURE: ALL LEVELS

Uncover the fundamentals of clay sculpture in this course for hand-builders and sculptors. Each session begins with a short talk and demonstration about ceramic sculpture. Experiment with clay slab-building and modeling to create abstract and figurative sculptures.

TECHNIQUE WORKSHOP: PINCH POTS

Dive into the foundational vet endlessly versatile technique of pinch pot construction in this 4-week workshop. Explore how to form vessels and sculptural shapes using your hands as the primary tools, learning to control thickness, shape and surface. Through guided exercises and personal experimentation, participants will develop greater confidence, precision, and creativity in their hand building practice. Perfect for both beginners and those looking to deepen their connection with clay through simple yet powerful techniques.

TECHNIQUE WORKSHOP: COILING

Explore the traditional and versatile technique of coil building in this 4-week workshop. Learn how to construct forms using coils with an emphasis on control, consistency and creativity, while covering methods for building both functional and sculptural pieces, refining surfaces and developing personal style through this time-honored technique. Whether you're new to coil work or looking to strengthen your skills, this focused workshop will give you the tools and confidence to build more complex and expressive forms by hand.

MEET THE INSTRUCTOR

Salina Ladha is a visual artist with a passion for ceramics, bringing over 15 years of experience to her creative practice. With a Bachelor of Fine Arts with a major in ceramics, Salina combines deep knowledge with a thoughtful, hands-on approach - whether she's in the studio or the classroom. She loves sharing her craft and helping others explore the art of working with clay.

INTRODUCTION TO SCULPTING A BUST FUGURINE

Learn the fundamentals of sculpting a bust figurine using hand building techniques in this 3-week workshop. Explore basic facial structure, proportion and expression, along with tips for building hollow forms and ensuring structural stability. This course is ideal for those looking to experiment with figurative work in clay, whether realistic or stylized. No prior sculpting experience is necessary – bring your curiosity and a reference or idea for the character you'd like to create. *This class has a one week break for drying and firing (no class on Nov 21).

INTERMEDIATE HAND BUILDING

Refine your hand building skills and explore more advanced techniques in this 4-week workshop. Build on foundational methods like slab and coil construction to create more complex forms as you dive into creative exploration and develop a stronger personal style in hand building. This workshop is designed for students with prior clay experience. It is not intended for beginner students.

INTRODUCTION TO DRAWING

Develop foundational drawing skills and constructive sketchbook practices with practical guidance from your instructor. Discover how to apply established drawing methodologies, including the seven elements of art, and refine your observational skills while drawing from life, photos and your imagination.

INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCED DRAWING & PAINTING

Advance your artistic practice through focused studies in expressive brushwork, colour layering, natural textures and symbolic storytelling. Refine your understanding of light, shadow, mark making and advanced composition, with an emphasis on mastering colour mixing, creating cohesive palettes and achieving depth and harmony in painting.

ADVANCED PORTRAITURE PAINTING

Deepen your mastery of portraiture through advanced studies in painting the human face. Students will refine their ability to capture likeness, emotion and presence with accuracy and expression. Explorations in composition, lighting, tone and shadow will elevate the impact of your portraits.

VISUAL ARTS COURSES

VISUAL DIARY & SELF-REFLECTION

Discover the power of visual journaling as a tool for self-reflection and creativity. Through drawing, collage and mixed media, tap into your inner world and reconnect with your authentic self – no art experience required. Guided prompts and intuitive exercises help you build a regular creative journaling practice, break through self-censorship and express freely without worrying about perfectionism. Inspired by the instructor's own journey as a migrant woman, this course offers a playful yet meaningful path to creative growth.

MODERN ART EXPRESSIONS: ACRYLIC PAINTING

Explore the fundamentals of acrylic painting through the lens of modern art movements such as Impressionism, Cubism, Abstract Expressionism and Pop Art. Learn to express emotion, movement and ideas using colour, texture, composition and brushwork, while gaining confidence with acrylic tools such as brushes, palette knives and mediums as you apply key techniques from influential artists through bold, modern approaches to painting. All levels.

COLOUR THEORY 101


Uncover the science and art of colour through mixing hues, tints, shades and tones. Practices in accurate colour matching and achieving colour balance and harmony will be demonstrated. By the end of the course, students will learn the methods of constructing a cohesive colour palette and the importance of working within a selective colour spectrum.

INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCED WATERCOLOURS

Advance your artistic practice through focused studies in expressive brushwork, colour layering, natural textures and symbolic storytelling. Refine your understanding of light, shadow, mark making and advanced composition, with an emphasis on mastering colour mixing, creating cohesive palettes and achieving depth and harmony in painting.

INTRODUCTION TO ACRYLIC PAINTING

Dive into the fundamentals of acrylic painting! Learn to choose and mix colours to simply recreate objects from life and photographs. Tools, composition, perspective, basic drawing and paint surfaces will be covered. Each class offers exercises to give you an opportunity to experiment, learn a new skill and develop your own creative approach.



SMALL SCALE HEAD BUST STUDY IN MONSTER CLAY

Learn essential sculpting techniques while creating a small head bust using Monster Clay – an oil-based, non-toxic and elastic sculpting material. Explore human proportions, facial structure and realistic texturing, along with various finishing methods. Through a combination of drawing, maquette building and hands-on sculpting, you'll build a strong foundation in observation, proportion, and surface treatment. Monster Clay is provided with the cost of registration.

LAND, LIGHT & LEGACY: PAINTING IN THE STYLE OF THE GROUP OF SEVEN


Explore the natural beauty of Canada through the lens of the iconic Group of Seven. Study the techniques, composition and brushwork of these early 20th-century Canadian painters as you experiment with texture, colour and light while creating your own landscapes in either oil or acrylic. All levels.

SELF & IDENTITY THROUGH PORTRAITURE

Create a series of self-portraits that investigates different approaches to the concept of portraiture and identity, incorporating various influences such as cultural heritage, inner states and personal experiences. Experiment with distortion, surrealism and symbolic elements that reflect aspects of identity beyond appearance. Work in your preferred medium, such as watercolour, acrylic or oil paints or drawing mediums, such as charcoal, pastel, fineliner and pencils. For intermediate and advanced levels.

ARCHITECTURAL MODELING

Discover the power of imaginative design in this engaging architecture-focused course. Through guided drawing exercises and hands-on model-making, participants will explore the principles of innovative architectural thinking and creative expression. Using simple, accessible materials and techniques, each person will develop and build their own conceptual model for a public space – blending creativity, structure and personal vision into a unique design.



INTRODUCTION TO OIL PAINTING

Learn to work with oil paints, with this step-by-step introduction to guiding you through a range of foundational techniques and approaches. Participants will learn how to plan and complete an oil painting while exploring key concepts such as underpainting, fat-over-thin, glazing, impasto and alla prima. Designed for beginners, the course provides a solid foundation in both the materials and methods of oil painting in a supportive, hands-on environment. Please note that only non-toxic, solvent-free mediums and thinners are permitted.

LANDSCAPE PAINTING: ALL LEVELS

Paint beautiful landscapes and gain in-depth knowledge on illustrating natural scenes that feature mountains, valleys, trees, rivers and forests. Your instructor will provide easy-to-follow instructions on composition, colour theory and perspective in nature.

CHALK PASTEL: STILL LIFE DRAWING

Explore the art of still life drawing using chalk pastel in this course designed for all skill levels. Learn foundational drawing skills, colour theory and pastel techniques such as blending, layering and texturing. Through guided exercises, you'll create dynamic compositions with realistic form, depth and lighting while developing your ability to observe and render objects with confidence.

BEGINNER DRAWING

Learn to see the world through an artist's eyes. This course introduces essential drawing skills such as understanding pencil types, values, techniques, perspective and composition, to help you confidently translate real-life objects and scenes onto paper. Whether you're just starting out or looking to sharpen your skills, you'll gain the tools to make drawing an enjoyable and rewarding practice.

MEET THE INSTRUCTOR

Vitaly Medvedovsky is a painter and educator originally from Kharkiv, Ukraine. He holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts from the Ontario College of Art and Design in Toronto and a Master of Fine Arts in Painting from Concordia University in Montreal. Vitaly's work has been shown in solo and group exhibitions in Montreal, Toronto, Vancouver, Stuttgart and



Berlin. He has received numerous awards, including the Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation Grant, the Plaskett Award, the Ontario Arts Council Emerging and Mid-Career Artist Grants, as well as the Canada Council Project Grant.

INTRODUCTION TO PALETTE KNIFE PAINTING

Explore the dynamic possibilities of painting with a palette knife in this hands-on introductory course. Learn how to create bold, expressive works while developing techniques to convey texture, volume and depth. Through guided exercises and individual projects, students will develop a personal approach to this energetic and tactile painting technique.

FIGURATIVE DRAWING & PAINTING

Develop your observational skills while gaining an understanding of proportion and basic anatomy in this drawing and painting course focusing on capturing the human form from photographic reference. Using a range of techniques and mediums such as charcoal, pencil, and acrylic paint, students will explore gesture, contour and the principles of composition to effectively render the figure with confidence and expression.

ABSTRACT & SURREAL LANDSCAPES

Move beyond traditional depictions of nature and explore more abstract, expressive approaches to landscape. Through painting, drawing, and sketching, discover how colour, shape and composition can capture the spirit and emotion of a place rather than its literal form. Experiment with layering, mark-making and dynamic brushwork to translate the emotional and atmospheric qualities of the natural world into an abstract visual language.

MEMORY & TIME

Create paintings inspired by significant memories or moments in time, exploring how time can shape and distort our perception of the past. Develop works based on personal experiences, experimenting with ways to warp, merge or reinterpret these moments to add new layers of meaning. The course includes painting, drawing, and sketching, encouraging creative approaches to memory and storytelling through visual art. For intermediate and advanced levels.

ARTIST STUDIO

Work on a series of self-directed pieces based on your individual interests in this instructor-led studio course. Create in a supportive environment and develop personal projects in your chosen medium with ongoing guidance and feedback in one-on-one consultation with the instructor. You'll be encouraged to explore new creative directions and techniques that deepen and expand your practice. Ideal for those seeking structure, inspiration and professional input within a flexible studio setting.

VISUAL ART WORKSHOPS

PORTFOLIO STUDIO

Develop a strong, personalized art portfolio in this 6-week workshop focused on creative growth and exploration. The course takes a multidisciplinary approach, encouraging work across drawing, painting, sculpture, digital media and mixed techniques. With one-on-one mentorship, peer critique and guided studio time, you'll refine your artistic voice, build a cohesive body of work and gain the confidence to present your portfolio effectively. Open to all levels, the course adapts to each student's goals and technical needs.

WILDLIFE AT CEDAR RIDGE: DRAWING & PAINTING NATURE

Explore the animals around Cedar Ridge through drawing and painting in this 5-week workshop. Learn to capture natural texture, colour and form using pencil, pen, marker, watercolour and acrylic. Study local wildlife anatomy and movement while developing skills in composition, colour mixing and shading. Ideal for nature enthusiasts and artists of all levels.

WATERCOLOUR: A BEGINNER'S GUIDE

Uncover the creative possibilities of mixing watercolours with liquids or other mediums to create delicate textures and learn essential techniques, including wet-dry and dry-brush. Your instructor will provide demonstrations and in-depth discussions about watercolour techniques, colour theory, and colour-mixing.



INTERMEDIATE MOSAIC PROJECT

Discover the art of mosaics in this 4-week workshop focused on Picassiette – a style that uses broken ceramics and found objects to create unique designs. The workshop gives a refresher/introduction to essential techniques, tools and project planning, followed by open studio time to work independently on larger pieces with instructor support. Open to all levels. Students are encouraged to bring old or broken ceramic dishes. This workshop requires an additional \$20 material fee, payable to the instructor.

INTRODUCTION TO ILLUSTRATION & COMIC ART

Have fun exploring a variety of different styles as you develop your personal voice in illustration and comic art in this 6-week workshop. Using both drawing and painting techniques with an emphasis on storytelling and visual styles, you will dive into the creative process for creating engaging visual narratives, from conceptual sketches to layout and renderings.

PET PORTRAITS WITH CHALK PASTEL

Learn to create lifelike pet portraits using chalk pastels in this 4-week workshop. Develop foundational drawing skills, explore basic colour theory and practice techniques specific to chalk pastel. Working from photo references, learn how to capture personality and expression while understanding how lighting influences form and detail.

MUSHROOM MIXED MEDIA PAINTING

Explore a variety of materials and techniques in this one-day mixed media workshop. Experiment with acrylic paint and collage to create rich, textured backgrounds, then bring your artwork to life by drawing and illustrating detailed mushrooms. Learn how to use colour, pattern and shading to create the illusion of depth and three-dimensional form while layering elements into a vibrant, finished piece.

BOTANICAL PAINTING ON OLD BOOK PAGES

Turn pages of old discarded books into works of art in this mixed media workshop. Learn to create drawings and paintings of fall botanical subjects such as leaves, seedpods and berries in pen and watercolour. Whether you're a beginner or an experienced artist, you'll learn techniques for sketching botanical subjects with fine pen details, and then adding vibrant, fluid watercolours to bring them to life.

VAN GOGH: STARRY NIGHT

Uncover the techniques and expressive style behind Vincent van Gogh's iconic Starry Night in this 2-week workshop. Learn to work with bold brushstrokes, vibrant colour palettes and swirling compositions as you recreate elements of the original painting and develop your own inspired interpretation. Ideal for all skill levels. All materials included.

Engage in creative drawing exercises that encourage personal interpretation and expressive exploration. Through a balance of technical study and imaginative practice, deepen your understanding and develop greater confidence in figurative and conceptual drawing.

FIBRE ARTS WORKSHOPS

INTRODUCTION TO WEAVING

Whether you're a complete beginner or looking to refine your skills, this course is designed to guide you through the fundamentals and creative possibilities of weaving. You'll learn the essentials of weaving techniques, including loom setup, winding the warp, basic weave structures, finishing techniques, terminology, loom descriptions and how to read weaving patterns. Participants are welcome to bring their own yarns and projects ideas. For those who are new to weaving, beginner projects will be provided. Yarn may be purchased from the instructor, for a fee between \$20 and \$30, depending on the type of yarn.

RUG HOOKING STUDIO

Work on independent rug hooking projects with personalized guidance and support in this six-week, instructor-led studio workshop. Whether starting fresh or continuing a piece, you'll receive technical advice and creative feedback tailored to your goals. Rug hooking frames and tools are provided for inclass use and must remain at Cedar Ridge. Open to all levels, this course offers a collaborative and focused environment to grow your skills and explore your personal style. Participants are welcome to bring their own yarns and projects ideas. Material costs vary between \$20 and \$30, depending on project.



INTRODUCTION TO PUNCH NEEDLE RUG HOOKING

Discover the art of punch needle rug hooking in this fun, hands-on one-day workshop! Learn the basics of the technique, including how to use the punch needle tool, set up your fabric, and create textured loops. You'll design and complete a small, personalized piece. This workshop requires an additional \$30 material fee payable to the instructor.

COURSES & WORKSHOPS FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES

CREATIVE CLAY (7-10 YRS)

Students explore the possibilities of creating with clay. Basic pottery techniques such as pinching, coiling, slab and glazing are introduced. Projects are designed to stimulate the imagination and develop pottery skills.

POTTERY MIXED MEDIA (7 – 10 YRS)

Learn about different types of art media and create clay-based masterpieces that may include decorative boxes, wind chimes, animal figurines, jewelry, mixed media paintings with glazed clay and more.

WHEEL THROWING (11 – 14 YRS)

Have fun getting a little messy as you learn all the steps to making a pot on the potter's wheel in this 5-week workshop. Discover how to trim and glaze your wheel-thrown pots for a spectacular finished creation.

WHEEL THROWING (15 – 17 YRS)

Learn to make a pot using the potter's wheel in this fun-filled 5-week workshop. Discover the technique of kneading clay, then learn to centre and throw on the wheel. Make a pot from start to finish, learning trimming and glazing techniques to create beautiful functional dishes.



TEXTILE ART EXPLORERS (7 – 11 & 12 – 16 YRS)

Get ready to explore the exciting world of textile art! In this fun and hands-on course, learn how to use fabric in creative ways, like collage, layering and appliqué, to turn your ideas into one-of-a-kind art. Along the way, you'll pick up design tips using colour, texture and composition and practice hand-stitching to add cool details and personal flair. Build your skills step by step as you work on your own final project that reflects your unique style and story.

CARTOONING (8 – 14 YRS)

Combine a love of drawing and storytelling and acquire the knowledge and skills to create a comic book with original cartoon characters – from storyboard to finished product. This course includes projects on comic strips, character study, poster art and seasonal cartoons.

YOUNG PAINTERS' STUDIO (7 – 14 YRS)

Experiment with painting styles like abstract, impressionism and realism, and develop new technical skills in acrylic, watercolour and ink. Learn the art of composition through self-expression, from portraits to still-life on various surfaces.


FAMILY FINE ART (6+ YRS)


