## Basement Flooding Protection Program Partial Road Closure at St. Clair Avenue East and Glenfield Crescent

**Expected Start Date: August 5, 2025**

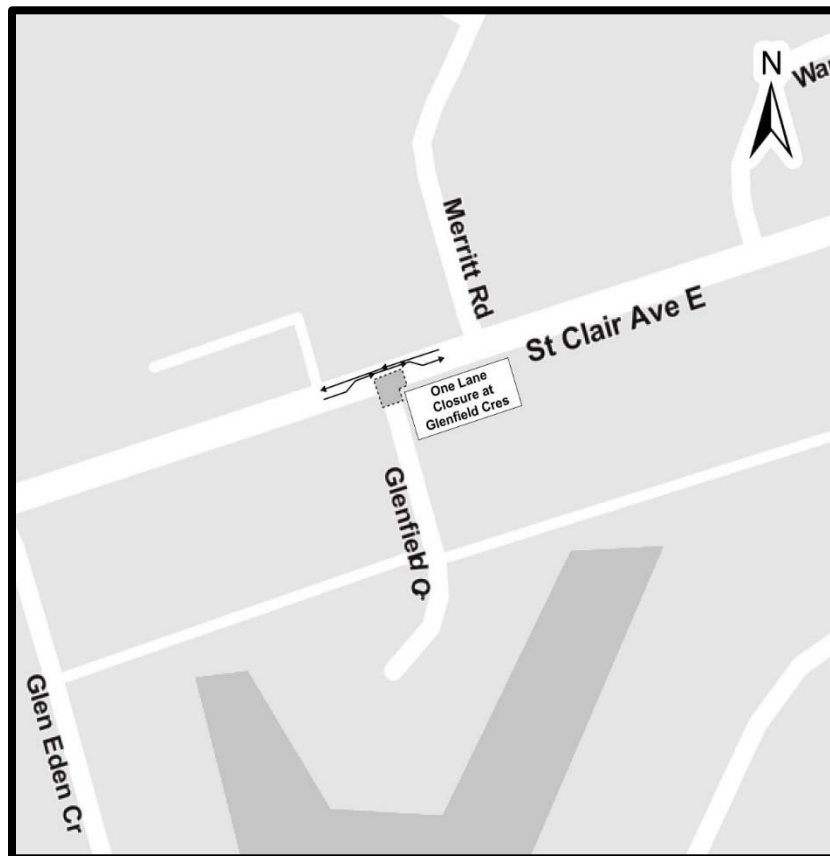

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary sewer systems in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. As part of the planned work, the City will be completing catch basins tie-ins at the intersection of St. Clair Avenue East and Glenfield Crescent. Construction is scheduled to occur during the hours from **7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 5, 2025, and Wednesday, August 6, 2025.**

A catch basin tie-in involves connecting a new storm drain to the underground pipe system. This helps manage rainwater and reduces the risk of street flooding.

- The contractor will complete catch basin tie-ins.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Glenfield Crescent will be reduced to one lane from St. Clair Avenue East.
- Continuous access will remain to and from Glenfield Crescent cul-de-sac.
- A Paid Duty Officer (PDO) will be on-site to assist with traffic and access.
- Residents will have full access to their driveway during this construction.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.
