TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES

Harbord Street Closed between Grace Street and St. George Street and Hoskin Avenue

Contract: 24ECS-LU-08SU

Start Date: September 9, 2024

End Date: October 06, 2025

*Timeline is subject to change. Paving work is weather-sensitive.

From **Friday, August 29, to Saturday, September 6**, base asphalt paving will take place on Harbord Street between Grace Street and St. George Street; and on Hoskin Avenue between St. George Street and Queens Park Crescent. The paving operations will commence at Grace Street and continue east towards Queens Park Crescent.

Also on **Friday, August 29**, crews will carry out concrete base road repairs on Harbord Street between Spadina Avenue and Bathurst Street. As concrete requires time to dry and cure, the base asphalt paving in this section is scheduled to take place from approximately **Tuesday, September 2, to Thursday, September 4**.

Due to the nature of the work, rolling closures will be in place between these sections to accommodate the paving operation. Westbound traffic will open at the end of each day.

Local traffic will be maintained, however, the use of alternate routes such as Bloor Street or College Street is recommended. Emergency vehicle access will always be maintained.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Pave base asphalt on Harbord Street from Grace Street to Queens Park Crescent and Hoskin Avenue.




WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise, traffic delays, and other inconveniences.
- The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.



Road and Sidewalk Access: To ensure the work is completed safely, road, sidewalk, and bikeway restrictions will be in effect within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.

	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated at no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Access for local traffic will be maintained.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need, or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
