
Development Notice Sign - Illustrator Layout Guide









1 Download the Illustrator template file

There are three templates ZIP files available for the <u>Notice of Proposed</u> <u>Development Application & Public Meeting Sign</u>:

Option1 : DevAppSignOption1Option2 : DevAppSignOption2

Option3 : DevAppSignOption3

Note: Upon opening each file, you may see a pop-up message about linked files. Simply select "**Apply to All**" and "**Ignore**"

Each template contains three layers that you need to edit.

1. Image /QR Code Layer

2. Text/Address Layer

3. Street Name Layer

(2) Fill in the Proposal Details

Change site address.

Change applicant name.

Add a short description with a few evergreen details.


Change the file number.

 Replace the general information number with your specific district number.

3 Insert a 3D Proposal image


- Double-click the existing sample image to enter the grouped image.
- Click the image again to highlight the existing image.
- In the top-left corner (indicated by a red rectangle), click and choose **Relink your image** to replace it with your proposal image.
- Adjust your image as needed.



4 Adjust Image Title Block

- Add street name on the image.
- Revise the legend to show any nearby buildings that are under-construction.
 - If none exist, remove the legend item from the legend.
- Adjust north arrow and add the date of application submission.





(5) Insert a QR Code

- Double-click the sample QR Code image to enter the grouped image.
- Click the image again to highlight the existing image.
- In the top-left corner (indicated by a red rectangle), click and choose Relink image to replace it with a QR Code provided by the City planner.
- Adjust the QR code's size and position as needed.
- Test the QR code on your phone to confirm it scans correctly.



(6) Insert a short URL

 Replace the existing URL with the new one provided by the City planner.
