## Storm and Sanitary Upgrade on Selwyn Avenue

**Contract: 23ECS-L03FP**  
**Expected Start Date: August 23, 2025**  
**Expected End Date: August 31, 2025**

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the construction work, the road will be closed at the intersection of St Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue effective from 7:00 a.m. on Saturday, August 23, 2025, to 11:00 p.m. on Sunday, August 31, 2025. This project is part of the Council-approved Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our ageing infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding. Phase 1 Construction will take place on August 23<sup>rd</sup> through to August 25<sup>th</sup>, and Phase 2 will occur on August 25<sup>th</sup> through to August 31<sup>st</sup>.

## WORK DETAILS

For this project, the contractor will:

- Excavate on St Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue to install the sanitary/storm sewer and restore the area.
- This work will be broken down into two phases and will require a temporary closure at the intersection of St. Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue, to all traffic.
- During the first phase, there will be no access to Selwyn Avenue from St. Clair Avenue East. Please use detour through Hodder St. via Joanith Dr.
- During the second phase, traffic on St. Clair Avenue East will be maintained in both directions using the east and westbound curb lanes. Please use detour through Plaxton Drive via Lane S St Clair E Glenfield. **There will be no left turn allowed onto Glen Eden Crescent and Selwyn Avenue from the westbound and eastbound lanes respectively.**
- The closure will be limited to St. Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue. Hodder St and Plaxton Drive will remain open and available for vehicle detour to St. Clair Avenue East.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise, and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.
	<b>Pedestrians:</b> The work will require temporary sidewalk restrictions. However, pedestrian detour access will always be available during construction.
	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., Saturday, August 23, 2025, to Sunday, August 31, 2025.
	<b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
