## Storm and Sanitary Upgrade on Selwyn Avenue

**Contract: 23ECS-LU-03FP**  
**Expected Start Date: September 6, 2025**  
**Expected End Date: September 13, 2025**

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the construction work, **the road will be closed at the intersection of St. Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue effective from 7:00 a.m. on Saturday, September 6, 2025, to 11:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 13, 2025.**

Work will be completed in two phases. Phase 1 will take place from September 6 to 10, 2025, and Phase 2 will take place from September 10 to 13, 2025.

## WORK DETAILS

For this project, the contractor will:

- Excavate on St. Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue to install the sanitary/storm sewer and restore the area.
- This work will be broken down into two phases and will require a temporary closure at the intersection of St. Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue, to all traffic.
- During Phase 1 of the construction, traffic on St. Clair Avenue East will be maintained in both directions using the east and westbound curb lanes. Travelling westbound there will be no left turn access onto Glen Eden Crescent. Please take the southbound detour on Plaxton Drive to Glenfield Crescent. Travelling eastbound there will be no left turn access onto Selwyn Avenue.
- During Phase 2 of the construction, there will be no access to Selwyn Avenue from St. Clair Avenue East. Please take detour through Hodder Street via Joanith Drive.
- The closure will be limited to St. Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue. Hodder Street and Plaxton Drive will remain open and available for vehicle detours to St. Clair Avenue East.

	<b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.
	<b>Pedestrians:</b> The work will require temporary sidewalk restrictions. However, pedestrian detour access will always be available during construction.
	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., Saturday, September 6, 2025, to Saturday, September 13, 2025.
	<b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
