

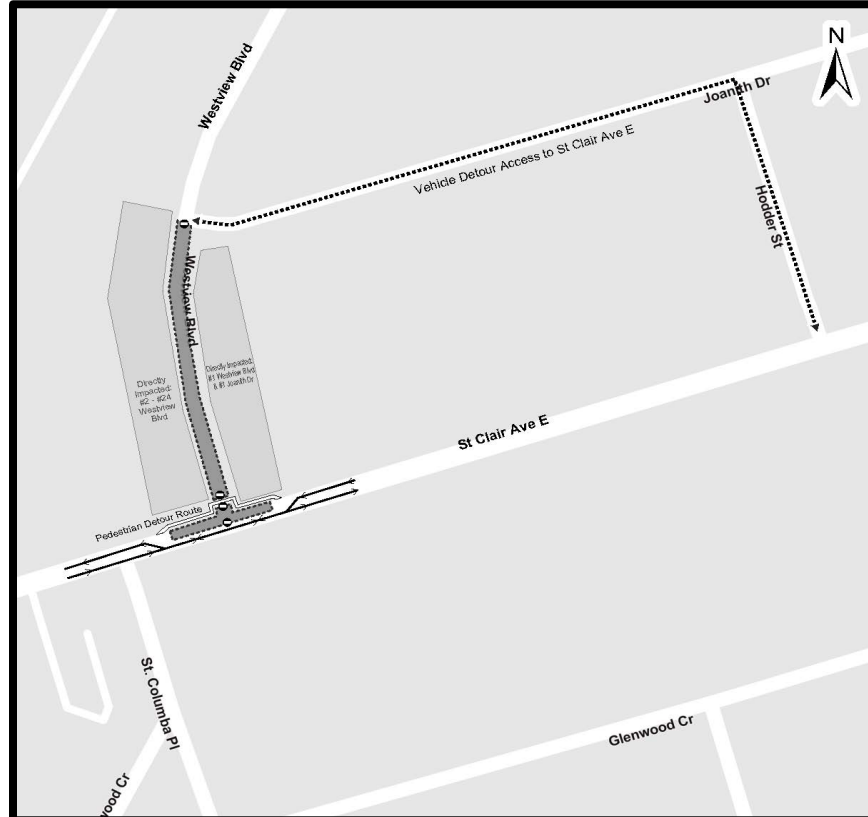

Storm and Sanitary Upgrade on Westview Boulevard

Contract: 23ECS-L03FP
Expected Start Date: August 11, 2025
Expected End Date: August 29, 2025

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the construction work, the road will be closed at the intersection of St Clair Avenue East and Westview Boulevard. This construction will take place from 7:00 a.m. on Monday, August 11, 2025, to 7:00 p.m. on Friday, August 29, 2025. This project is part of the Council-approved Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our ageing infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding. This phase of construction was originally scheduled for August 18, 2025, but the crew is working at a fast pace.

WORK DETAILS

For this project, the contractor will:

- Excavate on St Clair Avenue East and Westview Boulevard to install the storm and sanitary sewers and to restore the area.
- This work will require temporary closure at the intersection of St Clair Avenue East and a portion of Westview Boulevard, south of Joanith Drive, to all traffic.
- Some residents living on Westview Boulevard will not have access to their driveways during the construction period. The contractor will distribute Driveway Access Notices to those homes impacted by construction.
- The closure will impact St Clair Avenue East and Westview Boulevard. Joanith Drive and Hodder Street will remain open and available for vehicle detour to St Clair Avenue East.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise, and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p>
	<p>Pedestrians: The work will require temporary sidewalk restrictions. However, pedestrian detour access will always be available during construction.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Saturday, with additional after hours work and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
