Overnight Sewer Work on Harbord Street

Contract: 24ECS-LU-08SU

Start Date: September 9, 2024

End Date: October 6, 2025 | Revised End Date: November 28, 2025

The City of Toronto's work on Harbord Street is progressing well. This notice is to provide an update on upcoming overnight sewer work at the intersection of Harbord Street and Huron Street.

This work was previously scheduled from last Sunday, October 19, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. to Monday, October 20, 2025 at 5:00 a.m. However, due to rain, the work was not completed. The contractor will now perform sewer lining work at the intersection of Harbord Street and Huron Street from **Sunday, October 26, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. to Monday, October 27, 2025 at 5:00 a.m.** There will be no water disruptions or excavations associated with this work. This work is scheduled overnight to allow the contractor to complete the sewer installation safely during periods of low traffic volume and low sewage demand.

When this overnight work is complete, regular work hours will resume, and the road will be opened to maintain a minimum of one lane in each direction. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

WORK STATUS TO DATE

The contractor has:

- Completed all aboveground work, including road work between Grace Street to Queens Park Crescent West.
- Completed road work between Grace Street to Ossington Avenue.
- Completed permanent road base restoration throughout the project site.
- Removed and replaced concrete sidewalks and curbs impacted by construction.

REMAINING WORK



The contractor will between Grace Street to Ossington Avenue:

- Complete pavement markings.
- Restore transportation signage.
- Construct permanent bikeway dividers and green infrastructure features.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road, sidewalk and bikeway restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.

	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p>As an alternative, cyclists can also utilize the cycling detour that is setup on Bloor Street from Grace Street to St. George Street.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
