Project Overview



Project Background

- The City has partnered with Toronto Community Housing Corporation (TCHC) to convert the open space behind 200 Wellesley Street into a new park.
- This project was identified in the St. James Town Connects planning study.
- The design for this project was created based on community feedback gathered in 2017-2018.



Project Background

- After agreements were finalized between the City and TCHC, a consultant was hired, and detailed design began in 2021.
- Design concluded this past July, and the project is currently out for tender.
- Construction is intended to start in **Spring 2026**.

Design Scope



Out-of-scope:

Items or features that will not be included in the current construction:

- St. James Avenue Table Top this area is privately owned.
- BBQ City staff did not support this amenity in such an urban location due to reasons of health and safety.
- Community Gardens The southwest corner of the site, including community gardens, have been removed from the current project scope. The design of this area will be re-examined at a later date by TCHC.



Construction Phasing

Construction will be phased to minimize impact to residents, and new amenities will be opened as they are constructed.

- Phase 1: 2026
 - Playground and water play
- Phase 2: 2027
 - Large lawn, low hills, trees, community tables
- Phase 3a & 3b: 2028
 - TCHC landscape areas, garbage bays, Bleecker streetscape, stage, market, games rooms, Ontario Street promenade





 Large lawn, low hills, trees, community tables



 TCHC landscape areas, garbage bays, Bleecker streetscape






Phase 3b

Construction Impacts

- 3 years of construction activity
- Work is weather dependent
- Some areas will be blocked for construction
- Temporary relocation of parking spots
- Temporary relocation of garbage collection
