## Sherbourne Street Bridge Rehabilitation over Rosedale Valley Road

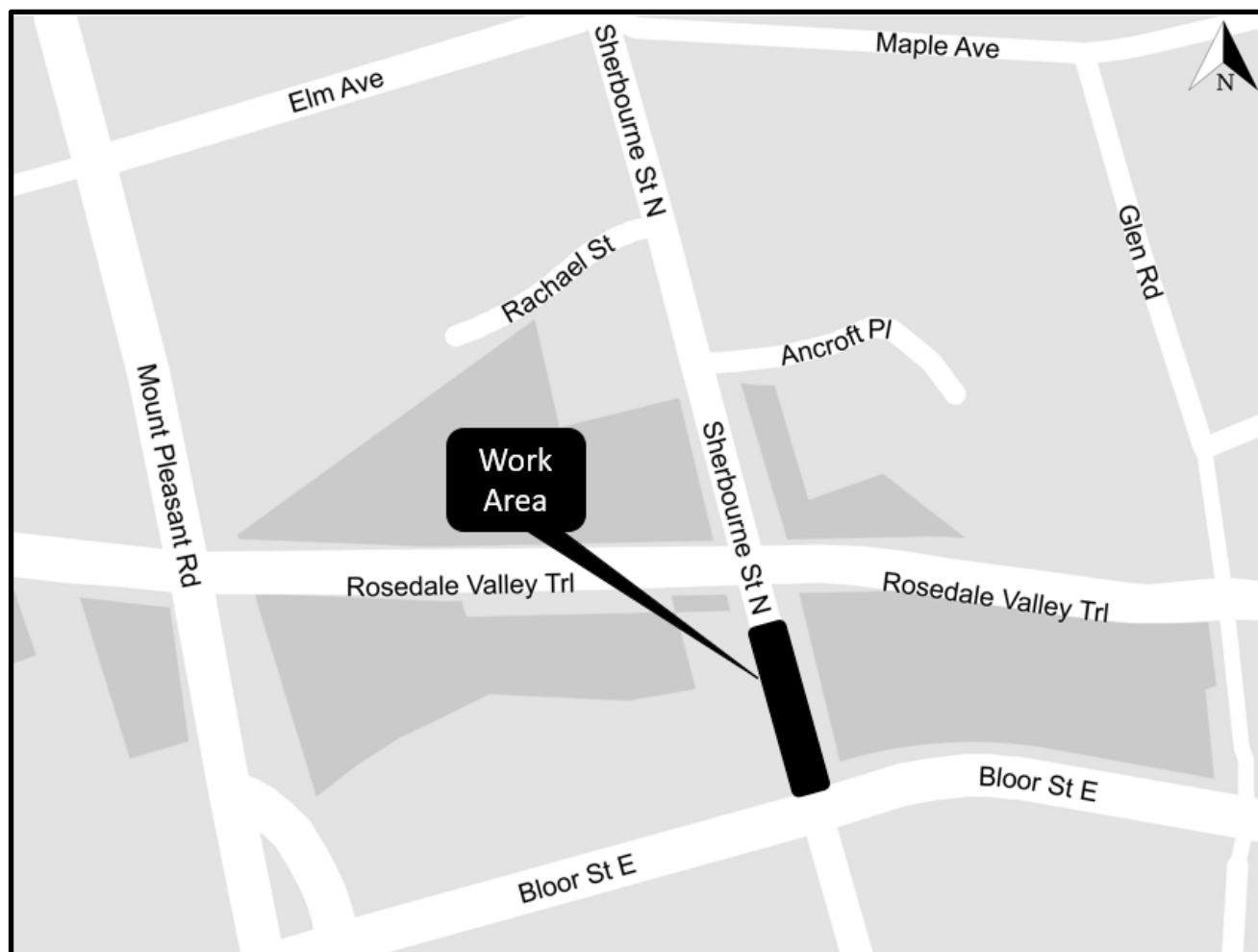
**Contract: 25ECS-BE-11AM**

**Start Date: October 2025 End Date: December 2025**

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Sherbourne Street Bridge over Rosedale Valley Road to address damage caused by a fire. This work will also ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2025 Capital Works Program.

### WORK DETAILS

The city's contractor will:

- Remove concrete and patch abutment and deck soffit
- Clean, coat and repair damaged structural steel
- Install a permanent fence around the south abutment





This work will involve bike lane closures and a northbound sidewalk closure on Sherbourne Street with no reduction of the existing traffic lanes.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.



**Work Hours:** Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

	<p><b>Traffic Management and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p><b>The northbound sidewalk will be closed for the duration of the construction period. Cyclists are advised that the bike lane will be temporarily merged with the adjacent traffic lane. All road users must proceed in single file through the construction zone.</b></p>
	<p><b>On-Site Communication:</b> There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
