Overnight Paving on Port Union Road from Lawrence Avenue East to Island Road

Contract: 22ECS-TI-22SP

Start Date: October 14, 2025 End Date: October 17, 2025

The City of Toronto's work on Port Union Road between Lawrence Avenue East and Island Road is progressing well. This notice is to provide an update on the paving operations.

From **Monday, October 14 to Friday, October 17 from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m.**, the contractor will grind existing pavement and perform road base repairs, where necessary, and complete the final top layer asphalt paving between Lawrence Avenue East and Island Road. Completing the paving work overnight will help reduce daytime congestion and allow the work to be completed within approximately 4 nights, weather permitting. Pavement markings will be installed after paving has been completed.

The Contractor is permitted to work 24 hours a day until the work can be completed and the roadway open to traffic. A minimum of one lane in each direction will always be maintained.

When this overnight work is complete, regular work hours will resume. Your patience and understanding is appreciated during this disruption. Thank you for your patience during this overnight work.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION



- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts.
- Trucks and paving equipment will be audible during overnight hours.
- Pedestrians may experience short, rolling closures near active work area.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. **Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.**

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.

Pedestrian Access: Access to properties will remain accessible at all times during construction.

	<p>Traffic Management: Motorists are reminded to abide by traffic/construction signs posted in local areas to ensure the safe travel of all road users. Efforts will be made to manage traffic and closures in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets during this work.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Traffic on Port Union Road will be reduced to one lane each direction.
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
