Storm Sewer Connection on Selwyn Avenue

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm sewer system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the construction work, the road will be impacted at the intersection of St Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue effective from 7 a.m. on Saturday, October 4, 2025, to 11 p.m. on Tuesday, October 7, 2025.

WORK DETAILS

For this project, the contractor will:

- Excavate at the intersection of St Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue to install the storm sewer connections and restore the area.

	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users, and residents.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There will be no access to Selwyn Avenue from St. Clair Avenue East and no access to St. Clair Avenue East from Selwyn Avenue. Please detour through Hodder Street via Joanith Drive. • The closure will be limited to St. Clair Avenue East and Selwyn Avenue. Hodder Street and Plaxton Drive will remain open and available for vehicle detours to St. Clair Avenue East.
	<p>Pedestrians: The work will require temporary sidewalk restrictions. However, pedestrian detour access will always be available during construction.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., Monday to Saturday and on Sunday, October 5, 2025, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
