Road Resurfacing on Jones Avenue from Dundas Street East to Queen Street East

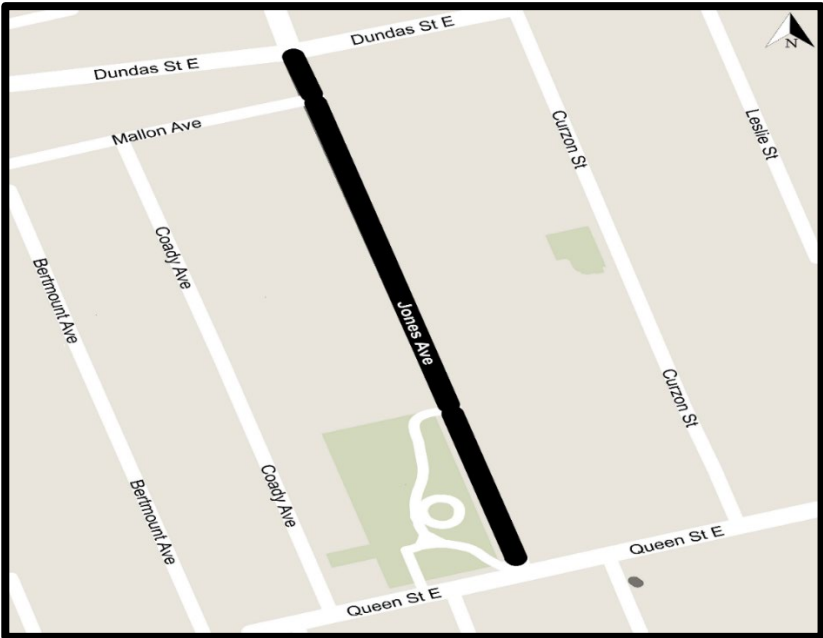
Contract: 25ECS-RD-03LR
Start Date: September 29, 2025 End Date: November 28, 2025

The City of Toronto will resurface **Jones Avenue from Dundas Street East to Queen Street East**. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving, and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

Major works in this road project will include asphalt paving, repair of damaged/unsafe areas of curb and sidewalk, installation of raised bike/bus platform stops on Jones Avenue north of Queen Street East and south of Dundas Street East. Works will also include road base repair, intersection accessibility upgrades such as curb ramps and tactile walking indicators and pavement markings.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2025 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

- The City’s contractor will:
- Repair sidewalks as required
 - Repair curb as required
 - Install raised bike/ bus platform stops
 - Grind the road surface
 - Concrete road base repair
 - Pave the road with new asphalt
 - Install new pavement markings for the road and bikeway.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
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	Pre-Construction Inspection: GPM Environmental is under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. The inspection will look at the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all homeowners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.
	Site Safety: Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the Site Inspector. If the Site Inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.
	Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage. This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Project Contact listed below.
	Telephone and Internet Services: This work may affect phone and internet cables for individual properties that aren't buried deep below the sidewalk. The contractor will coordinate with utility companies to minimize disruption. Residents who find their service has been disrupted should contact the Project Manager<u>and</u> notify their phone or internet service provider.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. • During road construction on Jones Avenue, contractor crews will occupy half of the roadway and the other lanes will be open for two-way traffic. • Motorists and cyclists will be expected to share the lanes on Jones Avenue between Dundas Street E and Queen Street E during construction.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location. • ON STREET PARKING on Jones Avenue will be restricted during the day and overnight during construction. • Residents with City of Toronto on street parking permits are directed to park on Permit Parking Area 8D (map attached) within the parking zone.
	Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment: 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or

	2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy. Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Project Contact listed below.
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - April to June and September to October.
	Asbestos in Asphalt: Asbestos was used in asphalt mixes throughout the 1970s and early 1980s to improve asphalt performance. Our tests show that there is a range of 0.5 to 1.8% of asbestos in the asphalt on Jones Avenue. The risk of exposure to asbestos for workers and bystanders is low. Air quality monitoring conducted by the City of Toronto at other sites has not detected asbestos fibres in the air when resurfacing asphalt. The City's contractor will follow the Ministry of Labour (O.Reg. 278/05) procedures for Type 1 Removal operations for low-risk exposure, including: • Wet the pavement during asphalt cutting, grinding or removal; • Attach dust collecting devices with HEPA filters to equipment, where possible, to prevent dust from becoming airborne, and; • Transport and dispose of asphalt containing asbestos at provincially approved disposal sites.

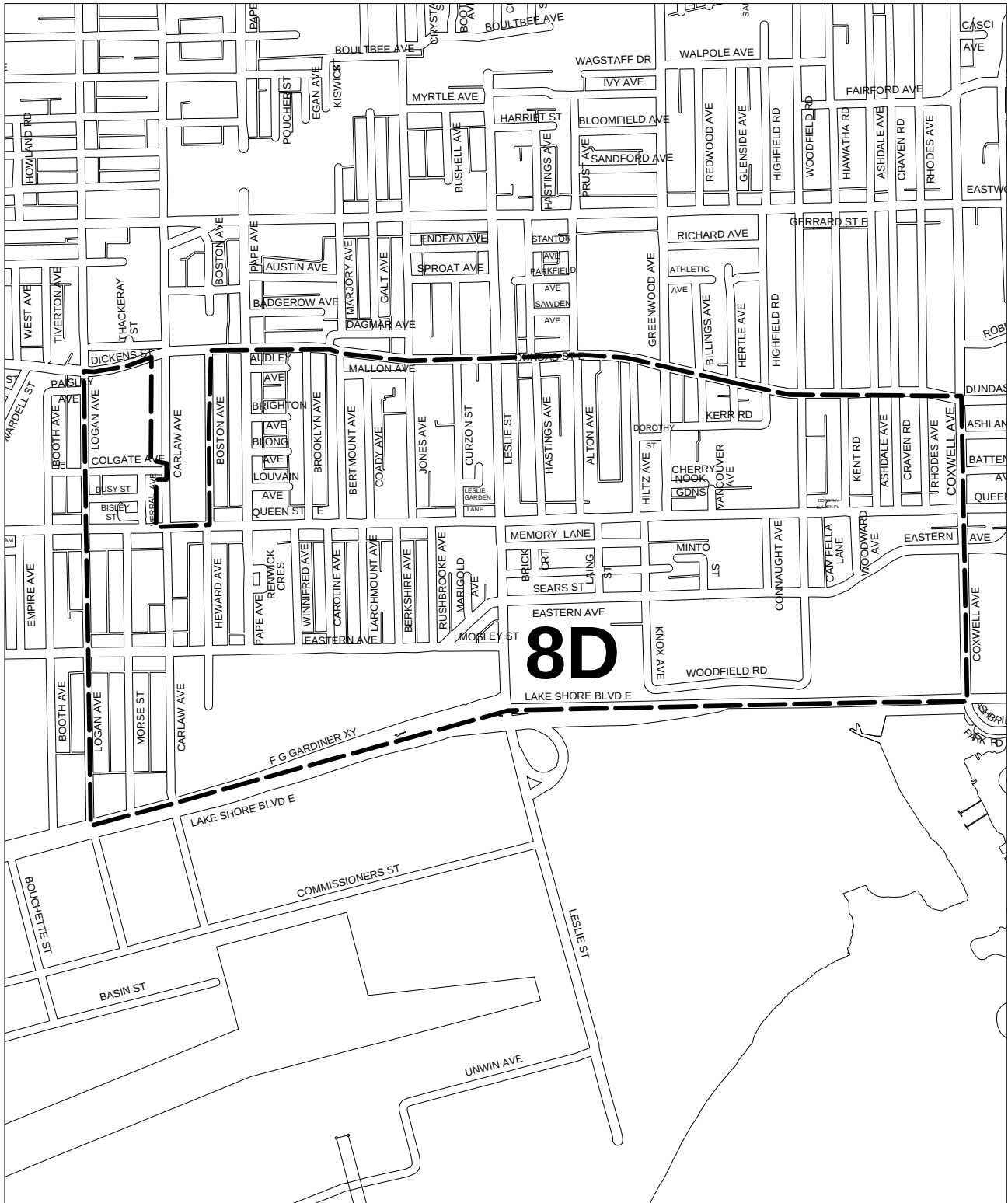

Permit parking is implemented on either a street name basis where parking is restricted to one specific street (or section of street) or on an area basis where licenced streets have been grouped into a permit area in order to maximize the available parking.

Not every street or section of street is licenced for on-street permit parking. Area based permit holders must first look for the "No Parking except by Permit" signs which display their corresponding permit area decal (e.g. 8A) within the boundary area, and then adhere to all other posted restrictions.

Street specific permits display a 5-digit code. This code corresponds to the street name entered when purchasing the permit. The 5-digit code is not printed on the posted permit parking sign. Permit holders must first look for the "No Parking except by Permit" sign on the street (for which the permit was purchased) to ensure that the section they want to park on is licenced for on-street permit parking, and then adhere to all other posted restrictions.

As a permit holder, you must comply with all No Standing, No Stopping, and No Parking signs (e.g. No Parking 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m., Mon-Fri).

A permit holder must park in a legal parking space and is subject to existing traffic regulations, such as, park 9m from an intersection (unless otherwise posted), park 3m from either side of a fire hydrant or park at least 0.6m back from a curb cut.

Where permit parking signs and pay-and-display signs co-exist, a valid permit holder is not required to pay the meter or parking machine.

Where permit parking signs co-exist with posted temporal restrictions (e.g. 30 min., 1 or 2 hour) and unsigned 3 hour parking, permit holders are exempt from the time limitations.

A permit holder shall be given a grace period to move their vehicle from 9:00 p.m. the previous night to 9:00 a.m. the next morning on changeover days for areas where there is a change in parking from one side of the street to the other side.

As per Service Ontario requirements, the vehicle registration and licence plate must remain valid and up to date.

A vehicle with a valid permit which remains parked in the same location on a street for more than seven days may be tagged and towed at the owner's expense.

Vehicles without parking permits may be tagged if parked in a permit parking space during the licenced parking hours shown on the signs. Vehicles without parking permits are limited to three-hour parking, unless otherwise posted.

The Permit Parking By-law is enforced by Toronto Police Service, Parking Enforcement Unit. Contravention of the by-law may result in the loss of your permit parking privileges.
