Watermain Replacement and Road Reconstruction on Scarborough Golf Club Road from Ellesmere Road to Lawrence Avenue East

Contract: 24ECS-RD-02MR
Start Date: March 2025 End Date: December 2025
**End date is subject to change.*

The City’s contractor has completed watermain replacement on Scarborough Golf Club Road and has begun road reconstruction on the east side. **Starting Thursday, October 9 until mid-November 2025, traffic on Scarborough Golf Club Road will be reduced to ONE NORTHBOUND LANE ONLY between Lawrence Avenue East and Ellesmere Road.**

Local access to side streets located on the west side will be maintained on Scarborough Golf Club Road.

As reconstruction work progresses, sections of Scarborough Golf Club Road will reopen to accommodate two-way traffic. The City and its contractor will use a number of measures to help manage traffic flow in the area, including modifying signal timing, electronic message boards, traffic agents and paid duty officers. Signs will be posted ahead of the construction zone to direct drivers and cyclists.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WORK DETAILS

- The City’s contractor will:
- Construct curbs and gutters
 - Remove existing sidewalks and construct wider sidewalks
 - Construct raised median islands and planters/green gutters to separate the cycle track from the motor vehicle lanes
 - Construct raised TTC bus platforms
 - Construct raised crossings
 - Install a new granular road base and pave with new asphalt
 - Restore driveways and other areas impacted by construction

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Traffic Management: Motorists are reminded to follow traffic/construction signs posted in the area to ensure the safe travel of all local road users, pedestrians and cyclists. Efforts will be made to manage traffic and closures in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets during this work. • Travel on Scarborough Golf Club Road will be limited to ONE NORTHBOUND LANE ONLY from Lawrence Ave East to Ellesmere Road. • Local access to side streets located on the west side will be maintained on Scarborough Golf Club Road. • Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

	TTC Service Changes effective September 15, 2025 to mid-November, 2025 154 Curran Hall bus service will operate southbound and northbound on Orton Park Road between Lawrence Avenue East and Ellesmere Road.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area. Please watch for signs directing pedestrians. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment: 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please contact the City of Toronto representative below.
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
