Road Restoration – Bonnacord Drive, Erica Avenue, Palm Drive

The City of Toronto construction contract 21ECS-LU-04FP has completed the sewer upgrade work to reduce surface and basement flooding. The next stage of construction involves roadway restoration, including asphalt paving.

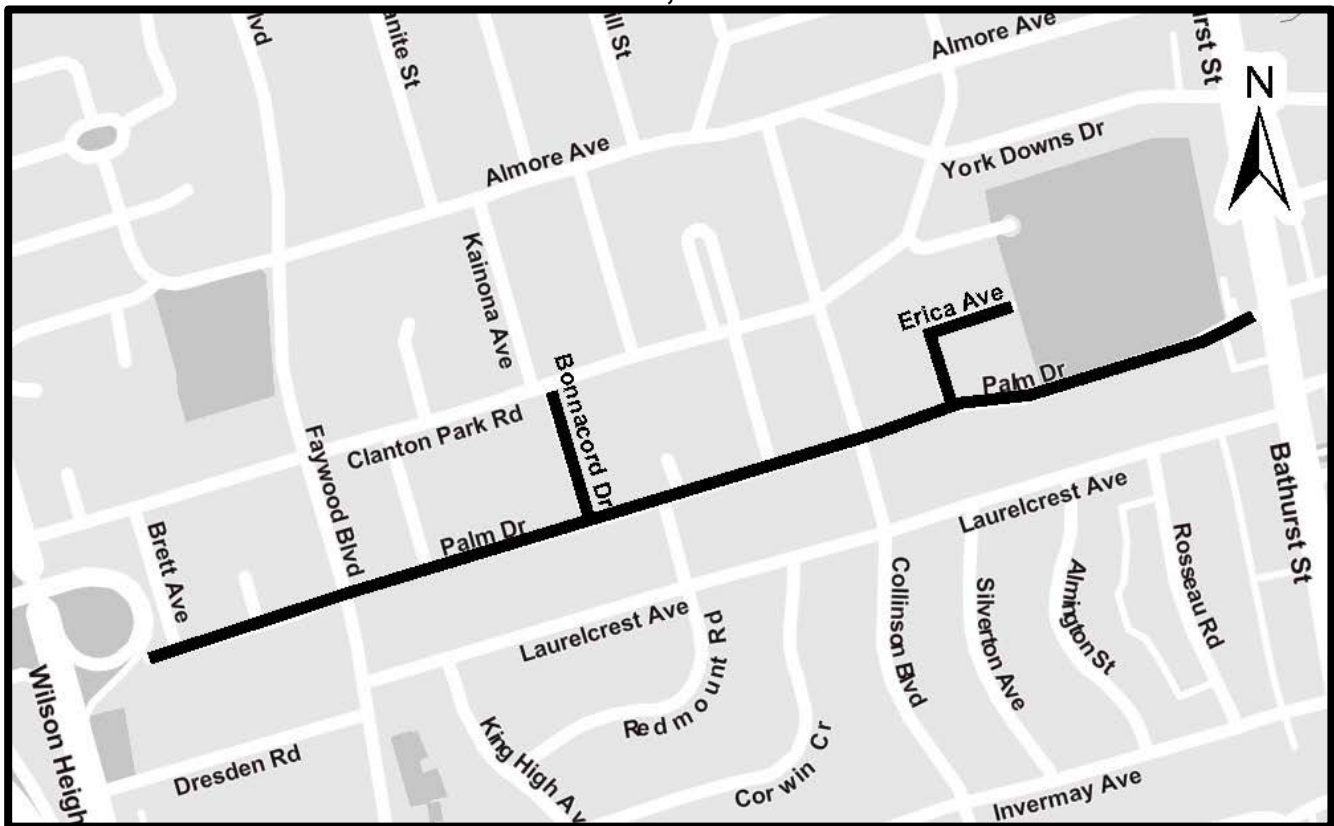
The asphalt paving work is scheduled for **Tuesday, October 7, 2025**, from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. The following streets will be affected by this planned work:

- Bonnacord Drive
- Erica Avenue
- Palm Drive

Affected road(s) will remain open to pedestrian and vehicular traffic, however, roads will be reduced to one lane in each direction. This may result in temporary impeded driveway access for residents. **The contractor will provide residents with advance notice of any temporary driveway access restrictions.**

The scheduling of pavement work is weather dependant and may be adjusted accordingly.

The City’s contractor will complete asphalt paving.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise, and traffic delays.
- Large, heavy construction vehicles in the area. Please exercise caution when driving.
- Rolling closures and restricted access periodically during working hours.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 8 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 7, 2025. A separate driveway impact notice will be distributed to residents.
	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff about the construction site, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below, or ask for the Site Inspector.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. When driving, please be mindful of pedestrians and other road drivers.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you always park in a legal parking spot.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment: 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy. Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones). To reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
