
This notice provides an update on the replacement of combined sewer, sanitary service lateral pipes, and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Ontario Street from Carlton Street to Wellesley Street East.

On November 26, 2025, the City's contractor will commence work on Ontario Street between Prospect Street and Wellesley Street East. The section of roadway on Ontario Street from Prospect Street to Wellesley Street East; and on Prospect Street from Ontario Street to Rose Avenue will operate as a two-way street to accommodate construction activities. Specific timelines are listed below:

• Wednesday, November 26 to Thursday, December 18, 2025, from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM, with the exception of Friday, December 5, 2025.

The contractor also plans to pause work during the winter months, with the last day of construction work in the area expected to be during the week of December 19, 2025. All traffic lanes will be reopened during this period. Construction activities are tentatively expected to resume in Spring 2026, weather pending.

Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.



Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.

Traffic on Ontario Street from Prospect Street to Wellesley Street East; and on Prospect Street from Ontario Street to Rose Avenue will operate as a two-way street from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM during this work period to support construction activities. After 7:00 PM and before 7:00 AM, traffic will resume one-way configuration.



Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.



Parking: This project will affect on-street parking on Ontario Street between Prospect Street and Wellesley Street, and on Prospect Street between Rose Avenue and Ontario Street in order to convert traffic flow to become bidirectional during work hours. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.

Local residents with parking permits are encouraged to park on neighbouring streets within **Permit Parking Area 7A** (see attached map for reference).



Parking Violation Notice: Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times. If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:

- 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or
- 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction.

If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.

Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (e.g., in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).

In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.

Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
