

Blue Bins (recycling) will no longer be City-run

On January 1, 2026, a private company will take over residential recycling collection and services in Toronto.

This change is due to a provincial regulation that makes companies financially and operationally accountable for the blue bin materials they put into the Ontario marketplace.

Proper Disposal to Keep Items Out of Landfill

You can make a difference by putting waste in its proper place and more importantly, by reducing waste.

Here are some helpful tips:

- Did you know household hazardous waste (HHW) such as paint, cleaning products, motor oil, lighting and medication need proper disposal? Visit toronto.ca/hhw
- Improper storage and disposal of lithium-ion batteries, found in many common devices, can cause fires. Learn about proper storage and disposal at toronto.ca/LithiumBattery

Reduce Food Waste and Put Organic Waste in the Green Bin



Your participation in the Green Bin organics program is making a positive impact – thank you! The organic waste you put in the Green Bin is collected and processed to help make a nutrient-rich compost, which can feed and nourish soil.

The City also creates renewable natural gas from organic waste, which the City uses to help power its vehicles and heat its buildings.

Reminders:

- Line your kitchen/indoor organics container or Green Bin with any plastic bag (hint: reuse produce or shipping bags) to help keep your containers clean. Compostable plastic bags are not necessary.
- Place any food waste in the Green Bin, not the garbage.
- To prevent odours, wash organics containers and Green Bins frequently. Both can be cleaned with dish soap.
- Separate food from any packaging (like plastic wrap, trays or takeout containers) before placing food scraps in the Green Bin.
- Remove stickers, twist ties and elastic bands from produce. Too much plastic or other contaminants can result in lower quality compost.







