Overnight Sewer Work on Harbord Street

Contract: 24ECS-LU-08SU
Start Date: September 9, 2024
Revised End Date: November 28, 2025

The City of Toronto has completed capital work on Harbord Street, with only minor finishing work remaining, which will be completed by the end of the year. This notice provides an update on upcoming overnight sewer work at the intersection of Harbord Street and Huron Street.

From **Monday, December 8, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. to Tuesday, December 9, 2025 at 5:00 a.m.**, and from **Tuesday, December 9, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. to Wednesday, December 10, 2025 at 5:00 a.m.**, the contractor will perform sewer lining work at the intersection of Harbord Street and Huron Street. There will be no water disruptions or excavations associated with this work. Overnight scheduling allows the contractor to complete the sewer installation safely during periods of low sewage demand.

Due to nature of the work, a **full road closure will take place on Harbord Street between Spadina Avenue and St. George Street**. After the overnight working hours, the road will be re-opened to maintain a minimum of one lane in each direction. Emergency vehicle access will always be maintained. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road, sidewalk and bikeway restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p>Access for local traffic will be maintained.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
