Watermain Replacement and Road Reconstruction on Scarborough Golf Club Road from Ellesmere Road to Lawrence Avenue East

Contract: 24ECS-RD-02MR

Start Date: March 2025 New End Date: Summer 2026

In March 2025, the City of Toronto began infrastructure improvements on Scarborough Golf Club Road from Ellesmere Road to Lawrence Avenue East. This notice provides an update on the status of work to date.

The City's contractor has completed watermain and substandard water service replacement, all sidewalks, curbs, and base asphalt on both the east and west sides of the road between Ellesmere Road and Lawrence Avenue East.

Starting in mid-December until mid-April, work crews will pause road reconstruction activities.

During this winter shut-down period, the roadway and sidewalk will be temporarily restored, and all traffic lanes will reopen to allow full travel through the area.

Due to construction of a new chamber as part of the watermain replacement, the work is now expected to be completed in summer 2026. A Construction Update Notice will be issued before road reconstruction resumes in spring 2026.

WORK STATUS TO DATE

Since this project started in spring 2025, the contractor has completed the following work:

- Replaced the watermain and substandard water services
- Constructed curbs and gutters
- Removed existing sidewalks and constructed wider sidewalks
- Constructed raised TTC bus platforms
- Reconstructed the road and placed the base asphalt.

REMAINING WORK

In spring 2026 the contractor will:

- Continue installing the new bike lanes (cycle tracks) separate curbs on both the east and west side
- Complete raised crosswalks on the east side at Greenock Avenue and Newark Road and west side at Chandler Drive and Painted Post Drive.
- Complete protected intersections at Lawrence Avenue East and Ellesmere Road
- Complete installation of the permanent traffic signal poles.
- Complete bioretention planters and green gutters on the east and west side.
- Place top asphalt and restore all boulevards and other areas impacted by construction.
