Watermain Replacement and Road Resurfacing on Maple Leaf Drive from Jane Street to Black Creek Drive

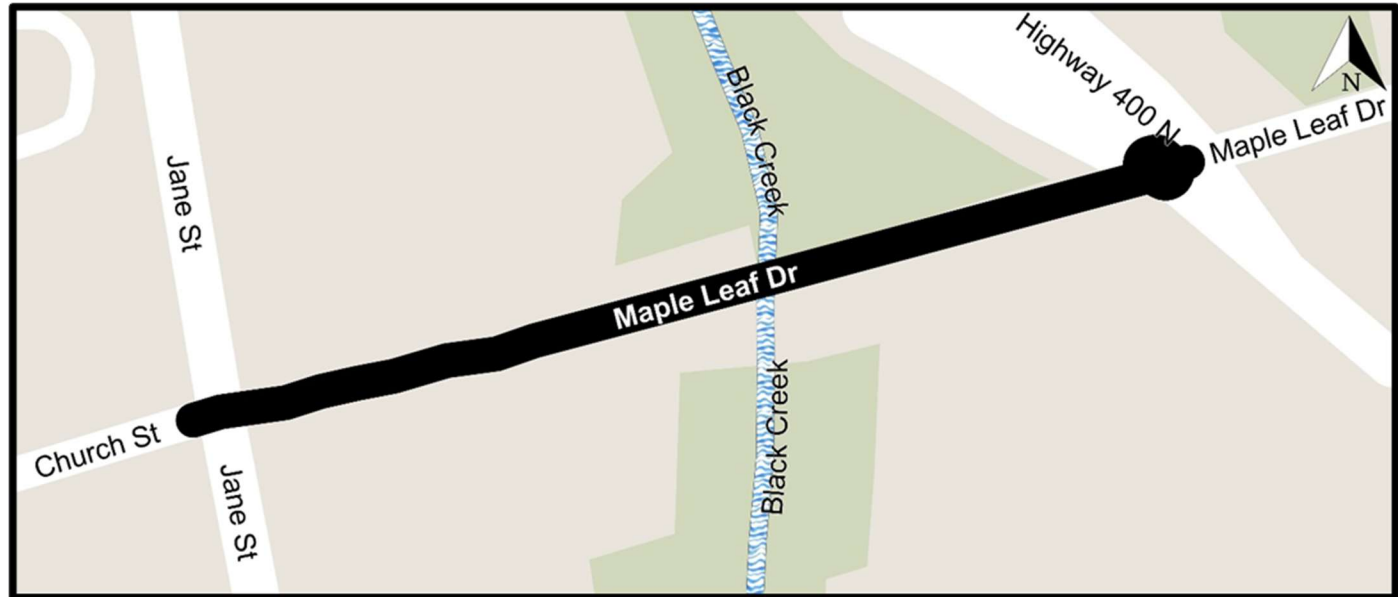

The City of Toronto’s work to replace the watermain and the City-owned portion of substandard water services on Maple Leaf Drive is almost complete. Permanent road reconstruction and restoration on Maple Leaf Drive will start in Spring 2026.

Once weather conditions are favourable, the contractor will return in Spring 2026 to complete remaining work. A construction update notice will be issued before work re-starts.

 - Transferred water services to the new main;

 - Temporarily restored areas affected by watermain and water service installation; and
 - Permanently restored sidewalks affected by watermain and water service installation.

- The City’s contractor will:
- Return in Spring 2026 to complete milling and paving.
