Penworth Road Culvert Rehabilitation over Massey Creek



The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Penworth Road Culvert over Massey Creek. This work will ensure that the culvert structure meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2025 Capital Works Program.

Work Details:

The City's contractor will:

- Repair and renovate the existing Penworth Road Culvert over Massey Creek
- Complete concrete repairs to the existing culvert structure
- Remove asphalt above the culvert to allow for concrete repairs to the top of the culvert and installation of a new waterproofing system
- Repair the existing stormwater drains in the top of the culvert
- Install a new armour stone retaining wall

in northwest quadrant

- Repair the southwest and southeast armour stone retaining walls by grout injection
- Remove built-up debris through the culvert and channel
- Remove vegetation overgrowth at the culvert inlet and outlet
- Replace the existing chain link fence at the culvert inlet and outlet

Construction will take place on two stages:

Stage	Work	Traffic Management
1	Work will take on the north side of the road.	Vehicular traffic will be reduced to one lane of alternating traffic on the south side, utilizing temporary traffic signals.
2	Work will take place on the south side of the road.	Vehicular traffic will be reduced to one lane of alternating traffic on the north side, utilizing temporary traffic signals.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

	Construction will be completed in two stages and trails and pedestrian access will be maintained via one sidewalk throughout both construction stages. In Stage 1, the north half of the road will be closed for construction and a sidewalk will be provided on the south side of Penworth Road. In Stage 2, the south half of the road will be closed for construction and a sidewalk will be provided on the north side of Penworth Road. Temporary pedestrian crosswalks will be provided on either side of the construction zone to maintain pedestrian safety.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. During each stage of construction, vehicular traffic on Penworth Road will be reduced to one lane of alternating traffic utilizing temporary traffic signals.
	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need, or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete, and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
