Overnight Bridge Repairs on Brock Avenue under Metrolinx Rail

Contract: 24ECS-BE-15PM

Start Date: As early as January 19, 2026 End Date: By February 13, 2026


*Weather permitting. Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto recently completed rehabilitation of the Brock Avenue Bridge under Metrolinx Rail, however Metrolinx has requested that the City carry out additional maintenance required to the bridge's bearing pads.

This work will involve clearing debris and applying protective grouting material. To ensure proper curing without interruption from regular train operations, some activities may take place overnight. Work is anticipated to be completed within five (5) nights.

We appreciate your patience as we complete this important work.

MAP OF WORK AREA AND WORK DETAILS



The City's contractor will:

- Repair bridge bearing pads
- Clean debris with compressed air
- Encase bearings with grouting material as required
- Provide temporary traffic control
- Conduct street lighting adjustments and improvements

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Overnight Work Hours: Work on this project will take place overnight, from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., Monday to Friday.
	Sidewalk Access: To complete the work safely, road and sidewalk restrictions will be placed within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Sidewalk closures will occur during certain construction activities, redirecting pedestrians to either side of the street as required.
	Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. One bi-directional traffic lane will be provided to accommodate traffic in both northbound and southbound directions with Traffic Control Persons or Paid Duty Officer(s) as required.

	On-Site Communication: There are times when contractor need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.
	Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	<p>Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) <u>or</u> 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. <p>If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.</p> <p>Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).</p> <p>In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.</p>
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.
