Consultation Summary

Public and interest group consultation for the Vaughan Road and Wychwood Avenue Safety Improvements Project took place from September to December 2025.

Consultation activities included individual interest group meetings with local property managers, the Oakwood Village BIA and other community groups, site visits with local businesses, a public drop-in event, an online feedback survey, and tracking of comments and questions received by phone and email. Over 45 people attended the in-person drop-in event, and 378 survey responses were received. Over 100 people provided comments by mail, phone and email.

Communications to inform the public and interest groups about the project and opportunities to participate in consultation included a project web page, targeted emails to area interest groups, over 4500 flyers distributed by Canada Post throughout the project area, social media posts and installation of outdoor promotional signage.

Overall, there are mixed levels of support for the project. In the survey just over half of respondents agreed that the proposed changes will improve safety and comfort for all road users.

On Vaughan Road, feedback generally identified top priorities being:

- Desire for safer bikeways on both sides of the road, specifically a cycle track on the south side of the street instead of the proposed shared eastbound lane.
- Desire to see more pedestrian safety improvements considered at intersections, including improvements to slow speeding and vehicle turning movements.
- Ensuring that traffic flow is maintained on Vaughan Road and that designs do not contribute to longer travel times.

Responding to proposed changes at the intersection of Vaughan Road and Oakwood Avenue, participants expressed the desire for the City to:

- Ensure the redesign of the intersection is safer and more accessible for pedestrians
- Ensure the existing intersection island is redesigned to be greener with planters and trees
- Ensure the redesigned intersection island functions effectively as gathering space for community activities, including activities hosted by the local Business Improvement Area including new amenities such as access to water and electricity.

Although 43% of survey respondents said they like the proposed contraflow bikeway on Wychwood Avenue, residents expressed strong concerns about the proposed changes to on-street parking and a directional change between Louise Avenue and St. Clair Avenue.

Residents contend that proposed parking changes would result in less parking supply in an area where demand is high and present more instances of conflict between people exiting driveways and cyclists. It is felt that a directional change would impact vehicle volume on adjacent local roads, increase traffic infiltration and make it difficult for residents to access the street.

In response to feedback gathered through consultation the proposed design for Wychwood Avenue is being reviewed by the project team and will be presented to the community for additional feedback. All other feedback gathered through this consultation, along with technical and policy considerations will form staff recommendations to City Council later.

Project Overview

The City of Toronto invited residents to learn more and provide feedback on road safety upgrades and opportunities to make changes to cycling, pedestrian, and motor vehicle operations on Vaughan Road, Wychwood Avenue, Arlington Avenue, Robina Avenue, Hursting Avenue and Maplewood Avenue. Proposed road safety upgrades include the addition of bikeways, intersection safety improvements and signal upgrades, parking changes, directional changes and streetscaping enhancements.

Road resurfacing is planned for 2028 on Vaughan Road, presenting an opportunity to make needed road safety changes and implement sections of the City's Cycling Network Plan in the near term.

Public feedback, along with technical considerations and City policies and guidelines will be considered in decisions to be made by staff and City Council.

What We Heard

- 52% of survey participants strongly agree or agree that the proposed changes will improve safety and comfort for road users, while 38% strongly disagree or disagree. 8% of respondents were neutral.
- Feedback suggests that the City should consider more pedestrian safety improvements at intersections more commonly used, including at Arlington Avenue, Wychwood Avenue and Atlas Drive, among others. Participants commented that, where possible, the City should include more traffic calming measures to slow vehicle speeds along the corridor. There is also concern that the proposed shared lane eastbound on Vaughan Road is unsafe and discouraging for cyclists, relative to a protected bikeway.
- There is strong support for the proposed redesign of the Vaughan Road and Oakwood Avenue intersection, specifically the existing parkette. Top priorities for the intersection identified by survey respondents and interest groups include accessibility for pedestrians, addition of green elements and the recreation of a space where the neighbourhood can honour its identity. While survey responses identified that 50% of respondents want to see a Bike Share Station added, businesses that participated in the consultation would like to see an accessible space that can host community celebrations, with access to electricity, as well as water to be better able to maintain green space.
- There is strong concern among participants who live on Wychwood Avenue that the proposed changes would negatively impact already limited parking supply, increasing inconvenience for residents on the street, especially the elderly and parents with young families. Additionally, participants felt that the proposed directional change could increase travel time and result in cut-through traffic on other streets.
- Feedback from survey respondents who are neutral or unsupportive of changes on Vaughan Road, as well as attendees at the Public Drop-in Event called on the City to prioritise traffic flow and not implement changes that would add to traffic congestion.

Survey

The survey was available online and in print format and included background information on the project. The questions included multi-choice or multi-select responses, in addition to open ended comment boxes and optional demographic questions. Included in the multi-choice questions was a mandatory question asking respondents to select areas of the project on which they wanted to comment, and this is reflected in the variation of respondents for each question. Participation in the survey was anonymous. See Appendix for survey participant profile.

Responses received to each question are presented in this section.


Question – Overall, do you agree that the proposed changes will improve safety and comfort for road users?



■ Strongly Agree ■ Agree ■ Neutral ■ Disagree ■ Strongly Disagree ■ Not Sure


There were 347 responses to this question. Of that number, just over half of the respondents (52%) strongly agree or agree that the proposed changes will improve safety and comfort for road users, 38% strongly disagree or disagree and 8% are neutral. A majority of those who responded 'strongly disagree or disagree' are respondents who provided responses for Wychwood Avenue.

Question – What do you like about the proposed changes for Vaughan Road? Select all that apply



There were 163 responses to this question, with 64% indicating they like the separated cycle track in the westbound direction, 61% like the safety improvements and shorter pedestrian crossings at side streets and 58% like the addition of green features on streets that intersect Vaughan Road.

Question: What concerns do you have about proposed changes for Vaughan Road?
Select all that apply.



There were 163 responses to this question, with 38% indicating concern that the proposed changes may cause longer travel times on Vaughan Road, 37% providing other reasons for concern, 29% indicating they have no concerns and 29% identifying a concern with reduced vehicle lane widths. Other concerns that were provided relate to the bikeway design, business impacts, safety, traffic flow and other general concerns, including added feedback on parking concerns.

Regarding the bikeway design, there was general concern about the proposed shared eastbound lane, with some respondents commenting that it is unsafe and does not encourage cyclists to use the route, and suggestions to consider a protected bi-directional cycle track on Vaughan Road in place of the currently proposed design.

Feedback expressing concerns about business impacts suggested that if the proposed changes on Vaughan Road are implemented, businesses will have challenges with loading and unloading, and customers with accessible needs might have a harder time accessing businesses, specifically on the north side of Vaughan Road at Oakwood Avenue.

Some respondents commented that proposed improvements do not address existing pedestrian safety challenges at Vaughan Road and Arlington Avenue and that additional safety measures need to be implemented on segments of the roadway where speeding recurs.

Other general concerns relate to the potential impact of implemented changes to garbage pickup on the south side of Vaughan Road, the impact on already-stretched City expenditure, no proposed safety improvements on several streets intersecting Vaughan Road (eg Rushton Road and St. Clair Avenue West). Regarding parking concerns, feedback expressed that it

might be difficult to find more parking if supply is reduced. There was also concern that the proposed plan does not maintain consistency of parking on one side of the street and does not allow pedestrians and drivers to focus on one side of the street for parking and opening doors.





Turn Movements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Proposed changes do not address challenging and dangerous left turns on streets intersecting Vaughan Road, including Atlas Avenue - Cars should be allowed to continue turning onto Vaughan Road from Oakwood Avenue

Question: What do you like about the proposed changes for the Vaughan Road and Oakwood Avenue intersection? Select all that apply.



There were 198 responses to this question, with 70% indicating they like that the proposed changes would provide greater safety and accessibility for pedestrians, 68% indicating they like the inclusion of new trees and 60% indicating they like the inclusion of a transit shelter. More than half indicated that they like planters with seating, and 14% did not like any of the proposed changes.

Question: What concerns do you have about the proposed changes for the Vaughan Road and Oakwood Avenue intersection? Select all that apply.




There were 198 responses to this question, with 43% indicating no concerns, 34% indicating concerns with the removal of the right turn channel and 28% indicating concerns with the restriction of left turns from Vaughan Road to Oakwood Avenue. 19% of respondents provided other reasons, including concerns regarding the configuration of the street and turn movement and traffic flow impacts.

Regarding the configuration of the intersection, there is concern about the two driveway access points to Sam's Convenience Store. Drivers may use these access points to by-pass signals at Oakwood Avenue and Vaughan Road and potentially come in conflict with pedestrians and people cycling. It is also felt that narrowing the lanes may have an impact on snow clearing and general vehicle movement at the intersection.


Much of the feedback provided by respondents who selected 'other concerns' suggest a correlation between proposed turn movement restrictions and traffic flow impacts. The main concern is that restricting turns at the intersection may result in higher volumes on side streets if drivers use these streets to avoid the intersection and will also impact the primary route of residents going to Eleanor Avenue. Conversely, some respondents commented that the restrictions will improve sightlines for drivers and generally make the intersection feel safer and less confusing.

There were 163 respondents to this question, with a large majority (86%) indicating they do not park on Vaughan Road, followed by 9% who use temporary on-street parking and 6% who use pay-and-display parking.

Question: What are your main concerns about the proposed parking changes? Select all that apply.



This question was presented to respondents who indicated in the previous question that they park on Vaughan Road. There were 23 responses, with 48% respondents) indicating concerns that it may be more difficult to find an overnight parking spot, 43% indicating concerns there may be more people parking on side streets and 30% indicating concerns there is currently not enough space on side streets to park their vehicle. A total of 17% identified other concerns, listed below:


- Parking competition will increase and make it harder for permit holders to find parking
- No consideration is given to older and disabled citizens
- It will impact garbage pickup between Ruston Road and Arlington Avenue

Question: In a few words, please explain your response. You can provide additional comments later in the survey.

There were 10 responses to this question, summarized below:

- Support for removing parking on Vaughan Road to improve the experience for most users who are not using the comparatively few parking spaces available
- Do not remove parking spots on Vaughan Road, as there is not enough supply currently.
- A lack of paid parking options will push more parking onto side streets.
- Parking on Vaughan Road between Northcliffe Boulevard and Dufferin Street should be made available only to permit holders or become pay-and-display parking for others looking to park.
- Recent changes on Winona Avenue and Durham Avenue have left people frustrated and this plan will increase frustration and make commuting in the neighbourhood difficult.
- Strongly opposed to the reduction of two parking spots on Connaught Circle, as parking is already difficult to find in the area, and the reduction of spots will exacerbate this issue. Support for added traffic light.
- Currently, parking on Connaught Circle is often not available and availability on other side streets is also difficult.
- With no driveways on the south side of Vaughan Road, there could be an unbroken line of cars along the south side that could block garbage pickup.
- Not concerned with parking.

Question: What do you like about the proposed changes for Wychwood Avenue? Select all that apply.




There were 219 responses to this question, with half of respondents (50%) indicating they like the new signal at the intersection of Wychwood Avenue and Vaughan Road, 43% indicating they like the inclusion of bikeways on Wychwood Avenue and 39% indicating they like the changes to the Wychwood and St. Clair Avenue West intersection. Respondents who selected 'Other' identified other elements of the proposal that they like, including:

- The proposed design could calm traffic, specifically speeding on Wychwood Avenue from Vaughan Road to get to St. Clair Avenue
- Not having to switch over parking halfway through the month
- Change to northbound from St. Clair Avenue

- Bikeway would be on the east side of the street where there are less driveways and potential for conflict
- Safer access to Cedarvale Park
- Directional change would improve traffic flow

Question: What concerns do you have about the proposed changes for Wychwood Avenue? Select all that apply.



There were 219 responses to this question, with 44% indicating concern over the changes to on-street parking, 42% indicating concern over the directional change for vehicle travel south of Louise Avenue and 41% indicating concern over no stopping/loading opportunities due to changes. A total of 24% responses provided other concerns than the options listed, including additional parking concerns, safety concerns, additional concerns about the proposed directional change and other general considerations which include identifying alternate streets to install the bikeway.

The additional parking concerns relate to safety. There are more driveways on the west side of the street where parking is proposed and drivers frequently reverse onto the street to exit driveways. Respondents commented that this affects sightlines and is hazardous, especially with cyclists using the road. On the point of safety, some respondents felt that the proposed changes do not consider the accessibility needs of many elderly residents on the street. Others commented that cyclists traveling in the opposite direction of vehicle travel many cause confusion and potential collisions.

Much of the feedback on the directional change referenced concerns about increases in traffic on other streets like Louise Avenue and anticipated increase in usage of laneways to avoid the directional change. On the other hand, a few respondents commented that, if the directional change is implemented and extended to all Wychwood Avenue between Vaughan Road and St. Clair Avenue West, it might make improve safety for vulnerable road users at the intersection of Vaughan Road and St. Clair Avenue.

Other feedback suggests that the City should not spend money on these changes but focus on other priorities, and consider installing the bikeway on other streets, including Vaughan Road east of Wychwood Avenue.

There were 138 responses to this question, with most related to the impact of the proposed directional change and issues with the proposed parking changes, as well as general feedback around the City's ability to fund changes given other priorities. These and others are summarized below:

Question- Do you have any comments about proposed changes to Arlington Avenue between Hursting Avenue and Maplewood Avenue?

There were 57 responses to this question. Comments generally indicated support for the proposed changes, but other key concerns and considerations included feedback around safety, traffic concerns, some opposition to the bikeway and general design considerations.

Regarding safety, there were concerns that installing a contraflow bikeway would result in the street becoming a speedway for e-bike users and scooters, making it unsafe for residents. There were also suggestions that it is unsafe to have vehicle travel and bike lanes going in opposite directions and that installing a contraflow bikeway next to parking is dangerous, as cars pulling out may have issues seeing oncoming cyclists.

Feedback around traffic concerns included worry that any changes to the roadway would result in increased car volumes on adjoining local roads also make it harder to drive through the neighbourhood.

Those opposed to the bikeway contend that the bikeway is not needed, as there are not enough cyclists to warrant these changes. It is felt that Arlington Avenue should remain as is.

Feedback about general design considerations included preference for a separated bikeway, adding more greening to the street, bringing the road to a state of good repair and being mindful that it is a narrow roadway and may not be able to accommodate these changes.

Question- Please share any additional comments, concerns, observations, or suggestions related to the Vaughan Road and Wychwood Avenue Safety Improvements project.

There were 195 responses to this question, summarized below:

Accessibility Concerns	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Proposed physical separation on Vaughan Road will impact health and safety for disabled residents, since much needed vehicular access to the front of houses will be completely cut off and eliminated - Re-look at proposal, as they may decrease accessibility for people with mobility needs
Alternate streets to be improved	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Consider bikeway on Pinewood Avenue instead of Wychwood Avenue - Difficult to turn southbound on Vaughan Road from Winnett Avenue, so more improvements needed here

Public Drop-in Event

At the November 13, 2025, public drop-in event, attendees were able to view information panels about the project and speak with members of the project team. Participant comments are summarized below:



Postal Code | n=378





Relationship to the Project Area | n=378





Typical Ways of Travelling In/Near the Project Area | n=378





Age| n= 306




A majority of respondents are of working-age (30-54), while just under a quarter of respondents are close to/ in the Senior Citizen age-group (55-64 and 65-74).

Point of Engagement | n=315


