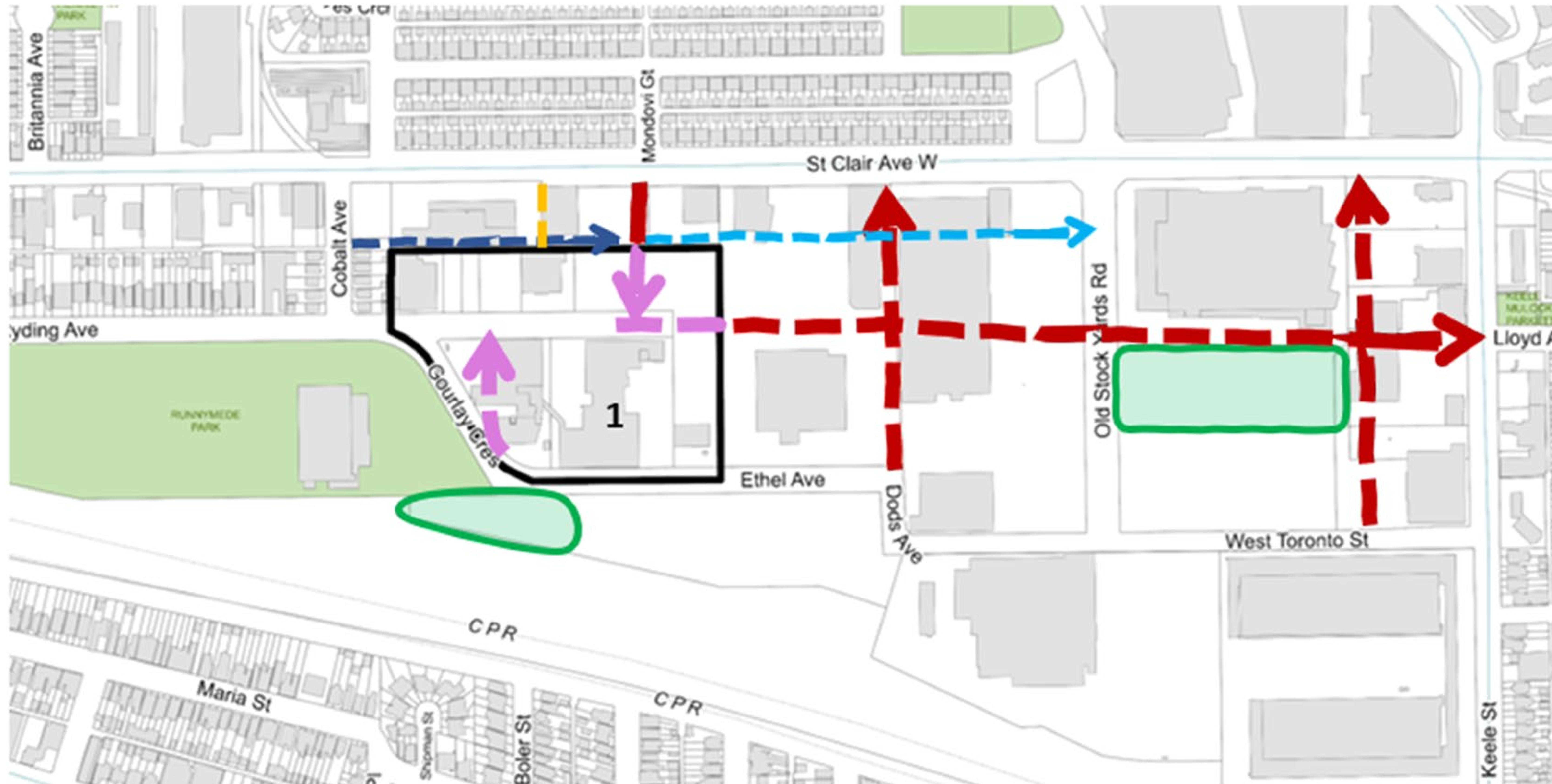
1. Large block - where should a public laneway or public street go near the location labelled '1'?

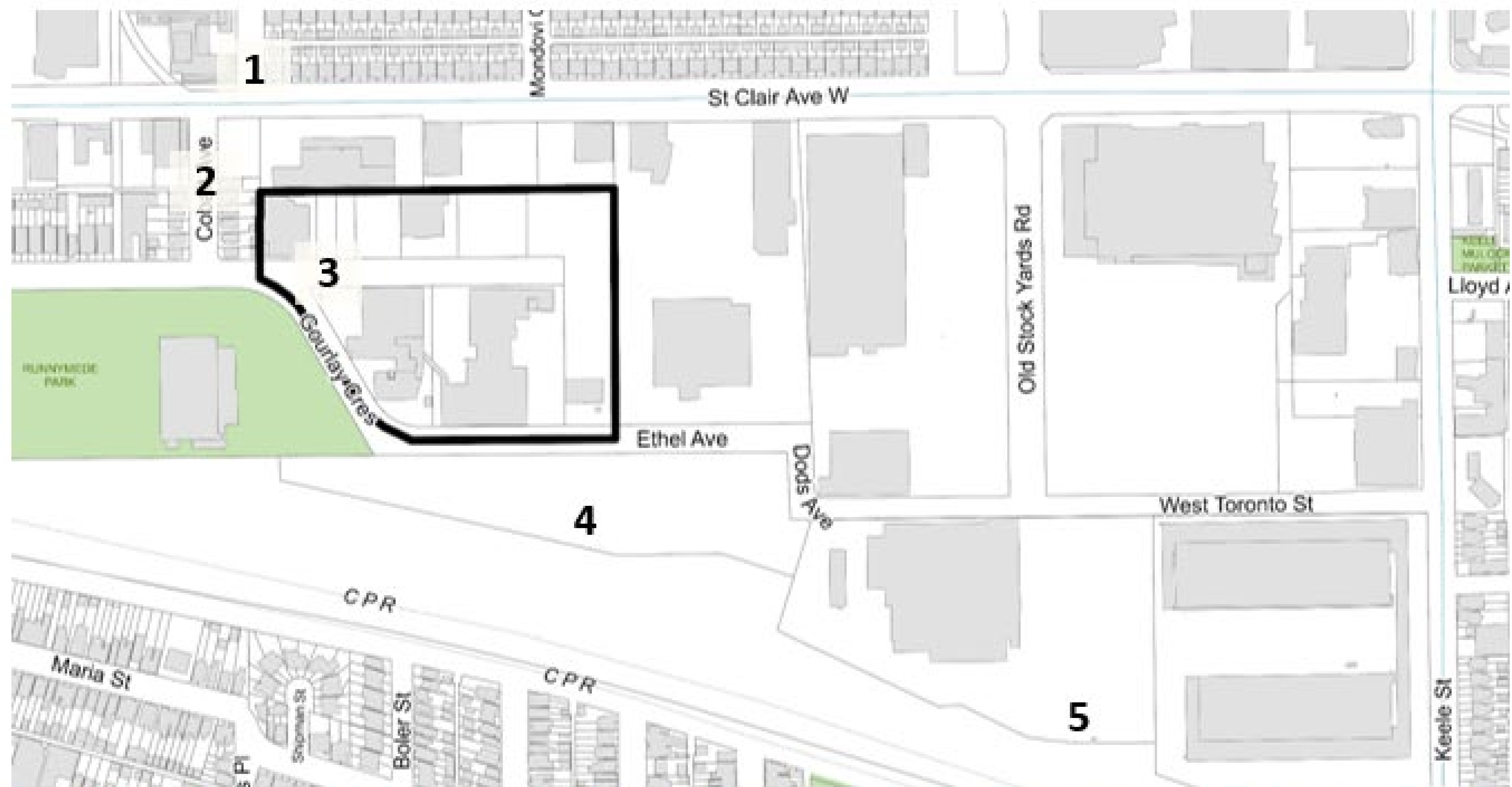

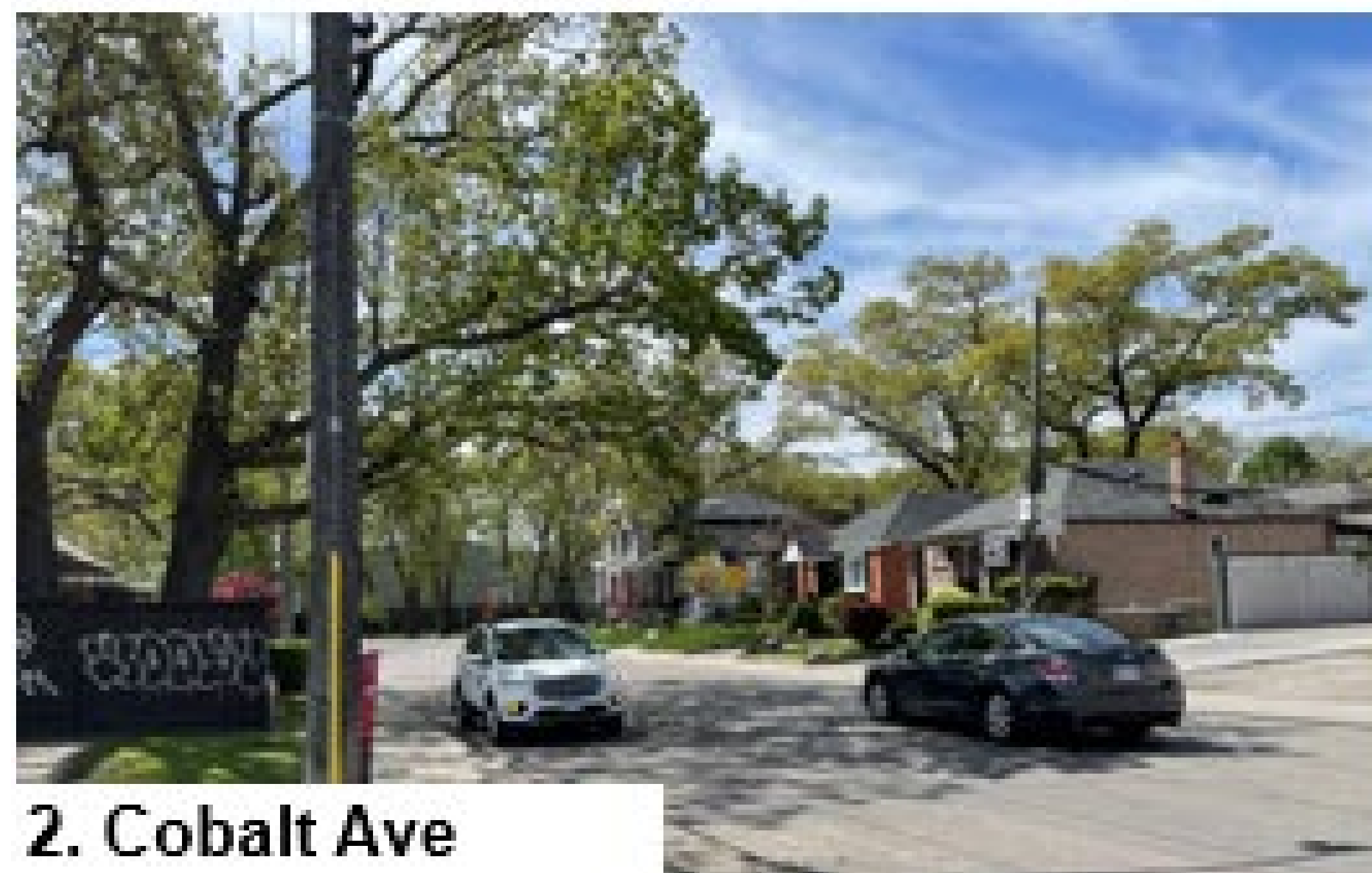
# Ryding Lands Study Area

The Ryding Lands is comprised of 99, 109, 116, 116R and 126-142 Ryding Avenue and 90 Ethel Avenue. These lands are the focus of the Ryding Lands Study and are 3.15 hectares (7.78 acres) in size.

The final study boundary may be different depending in part on public feedback.

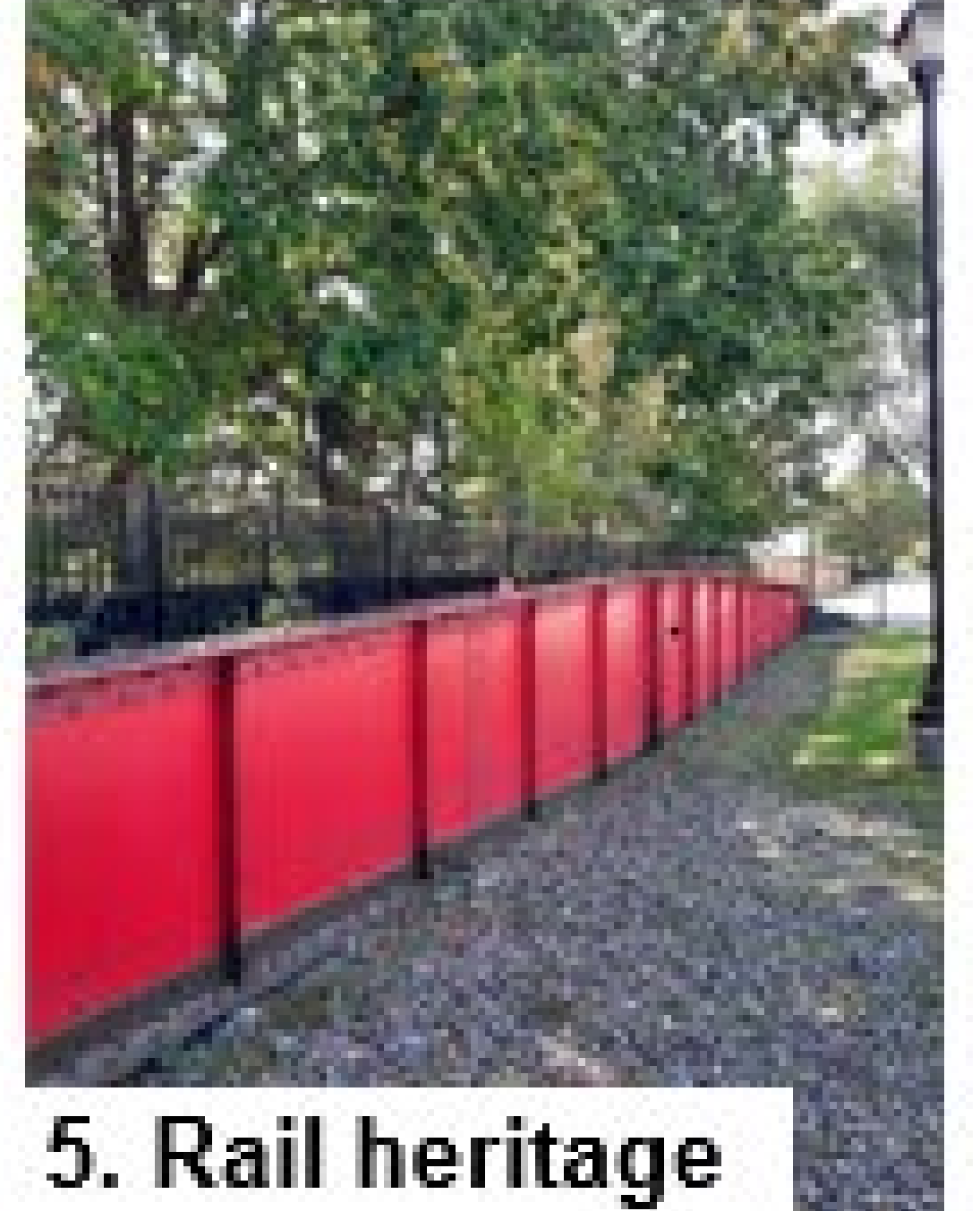
