



Sanitary Sewer Installation on WESTVIEW BOULEVARD

Contract 23ECS-LU-03FP
Start Date: February 23, 2026
Expected End Date: March 31, 2026

The City of Toronto is upgrading the sanitary sewer system along a portion of Westview Boulevard to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the location of the sewers and nature of the construction work, Westview Boulevard will be temporarily closed from south of Barrett Road to slightly south of Dalecrest Drive. This road closure will occur from 7 a.m. Monday, February 23, 2026, until 7 p.m. Tuesday, March 31, 2026.

WORK DETAILS

The contractor will:

- Upgrade the storm and sanitary sewer system to reduce surface and basement flooding.
- The work area extends from 66 Westview Boulevard to 88 Westview Boulevard.
- The work zone will be closed to non-local traffic from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday. Residents will continue to have road access.
- During the construction, driveways may be impacted for varying periods of time. If a driveway closure is required, Driveway Impact Notices will be distributed to those affected when necessary.
- When driveway access is not available, please park in a legal spot on a local side street and display the Driveway Impact Notice in your windshield.

	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users, and residents.</p> <p>Traffic Detour – Drivers can access Westview Boulevard from Selwyn Avenue using Gardens Crescent and Barrett Road.</p>
	<p>Pedestrians: Sidewalks will be fully accessible on both sides of the street.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>

	<p>Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure you always park in a legal parking spot.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or

2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction.

If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.

Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e., in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).

To reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
