## CONSTRUCTION IMPACT Norfield Crescent

**Contract: 23ECS-LU-10FP**  
**Start Date: February 17, 2026**

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the construction work, there will be traffic impact in your area. The expected date for the **road closure** on Norfield Crescent is from **7:00 A.M. on February 17, 2026, to 5:00 P.M. on February 23, 2026.**

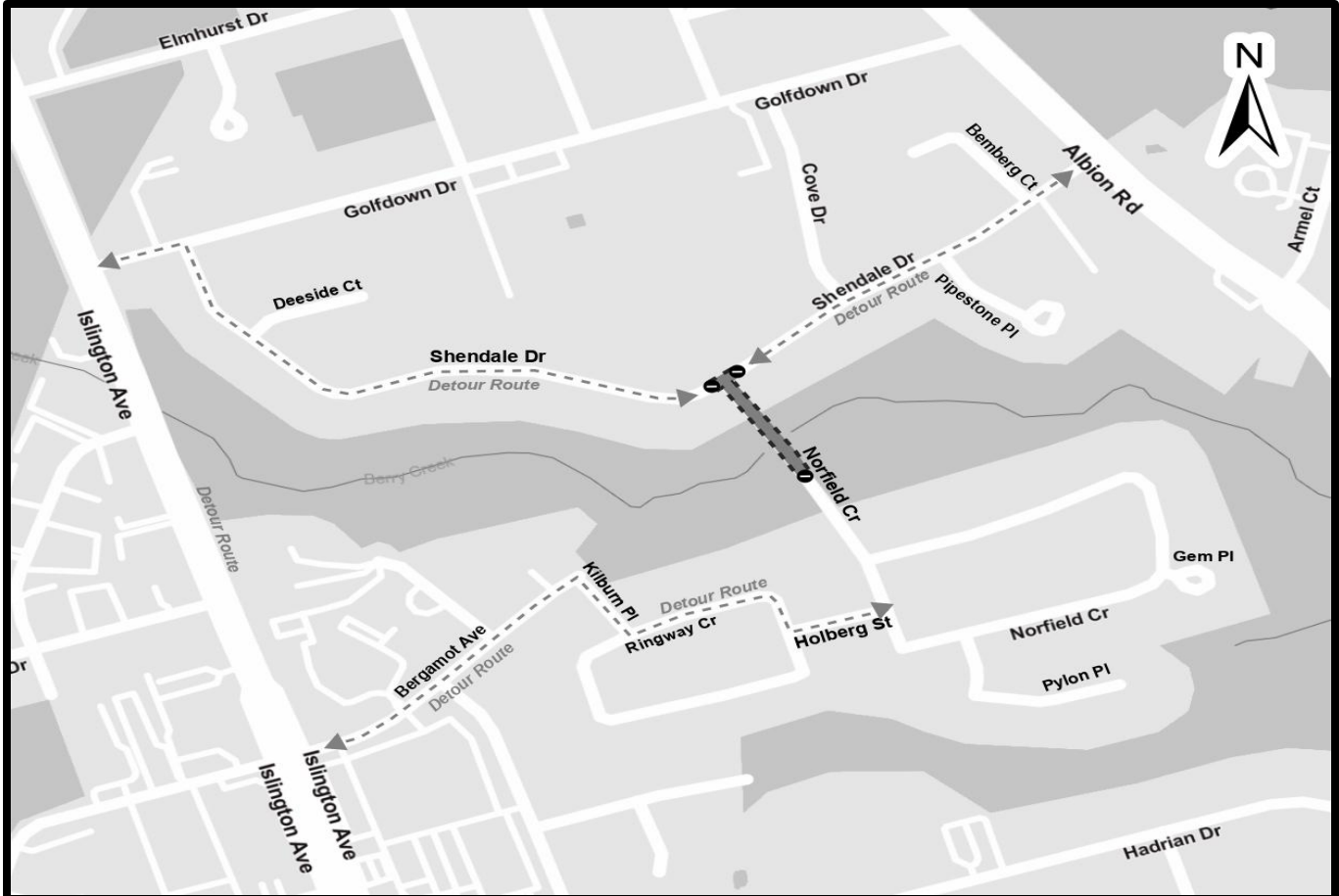
This project is part of the Council-approved 2025 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

### WORK DETAILS

For this project, the contractor will:

- Excavate on Norfield Crescent to install the sanitary sewer and allocate space on Norfield Crescent for material storage during construction, followed by restoration of the area at a later date.
- This work will require the temporary **rolling road closure** of Norfield Crescent to all traffic. Local and emergency access will be maintained.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION




- The community will experience dust, noise, and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.



**Traffic Management:** Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users, and residents.

### Traffic Detour:

- Norfield Crescent will be closed fully to all through traffic from North of Holberg Street to Shendale Drive, including the intersection.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Traffic on Shendale Drive can exit and enter via Golfdownd Drive to the West, to/from Islington Avenue.</li> <li>• Traffic on Shendale Drive can exit and enter to the East, to/from Albion Road.</li> <li>• Traffic on Norfield Crescent can exit and enter via Bergamot Avenue to the west, to/from Islington Avenue.</li> <li>• During the road closure, residents will have access to their driveways except when construction is occurring in front of their property. Driveway Impact Notices will be distributed on an ongoing basis as necessary.</li> <li>• When driveway access is not available, please park in a legal spot on a local side street and display the Driveway Impact Notice in your windshield.</li> </ul>
	<b>Pedestrians:</b> The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions; however, any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.
	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place during the weekday from <b>7:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.</b>
	<b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
