## Humber Creek Restoration West of Scarlett Road (Phase 2): Saturday Work Effective February 28



**Start Date: Summer 2025 | End Date: Summer 2026**

This notice provides an update on contract # 25ECS-LU-01SM; specifically, that in addition to current weekdays, work **will now occur on Saturdays** effective February 28, 2026.

Following weather-related delays and unforeseen site conditions, work on Saturdays is required to maintain the project schedule and to ensure that work is finished to meet regulatory environmental timeframes and avoid extended disruption within the community.

The scope of work remains the same. The Primary Work Area is an approximately 300-metre length of creek, starting from the base of the Chapman Road access and extending upstream. This work will provide erosion protection to the sanitary trunk sewer system by installing bank protection on Humber Creek and raising the creek bed to protect exposed infrastructure. A Secondary Work Area consists of an approximately 20-metre length of creek at Scarlett Road, where work will provide additional rehabilitation and erosion mitigation within the watercourse following the 2022 culvert replacement.

### WORK STATUS TO DATE

The City's contractor has:

- Established construction access and staging areas off Chapman Road and La Rush Drive, including installation of erosion and sediment control measures, construction fencing, traffic control and safety signage.
- Performed inspections and maintenance on critical infrastructure, including the encasement of exposed sanitary trunk sewer
- Completed work within Humber Creek at Scarlett Road (Secondary Work Area) to provide additional rehabilitation and erosion mitigation within the watercourse following the 2022 culvert replacement.
- Initiated in-water construction within the Primary Work Area for erosion protection.

### REMAINING WORK

The City's contractor will:

- Continue to temporarily restrict pedestrian access through Chapman Valley Park to allow for construction and staging areas.

- Manage traffic at the construction access entrances from Chapman Road and La Rush Drive to ensure the safe movement of construction equipment and vehicles and minimize traffic disruptions.
- Work within the Primary Work Area to rehabilitate the creek and protect multiple exposed sanitary trunk sewer crossings from watercourse erosion.
- Restore disturbed areas, and complete post construction infrastructure inspections.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, <b>and on Saturdays from 7:30am to 5:00pm.</b></p>
	<p><b>On-Site Communication:</b> There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about site access, pre-construction inspections or short-term trail closures. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> There may be intermittent road or sidewalk restrictions at access points on Chapman Road and La Rush Drive while equipment is brought to the work site. Flaggers will be posted at accesses for safety. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. <b>During construction, there will be minor delays and increased traffic on Chapman Road and La Rush Drive.</b></p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions or mitigation measures that may impact your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p><b>Tree Removal:</b> Due to the nature of this project, the City will have to remove trees from public property parallel to Humber Creek. A tree removal permit has been obtained in coordination with the City's Ravine and Natural Feature Protection group. A naturalized habitat restoration plan was developed with a variety of native species to restore all impacted areas and will be implemented by the City's Urban Forestry division following construction.</p>
	<p><b>Parks and Trails:</b> The trails within Chapman Valley Park will be temporarily closed to allow for safe construction and staging.</p>
