Scarlett Road Bridge Replacement



The City of Toronto is preparing for the upcoming replacement of the Scarlett Road bridge and reconstruction of the intersection of Scarlett Road, Dundas Street West and St. Clair Avenue West. Before this work can begin the City has had to coordinate with all utility companies to relocate their underground and above-ground infrastructure. This will minimize risks during the bridge and road construction.

Enbridge Gas, Bell, Rogers Communications, and Lumen Technologies have completed their relocation work in the area. The communication utilities will return to pull cables, and this work is expected to cause minimal disruption. Toronto Hydro's relocation work is currently underway.

PROJECT DETAILS

Timing for the start of the bridge and road construction is still to be confirmed. Once confirmed, residents will receive a Pre-Construction Notice, two to three months before the bridge work is scheduled to begin. A public information meeting will be held to share information about construction plans, impacts and timelines. Subscribe to receive project updates at toronto.ca/Scarlett.

The City's work will include:

- Replacement of the railway bridge above Scarlett Road and the addition of one northbound lane and one southbound lane under the bridge for a total of two lanes in each direction
- Lowering Scarlett Road to allow large vehicles and trucks to pass underneath the bridge
- New lighting under the bridge
- Improved sidewalks under the bridge and at the intersections at Scarlett Road and Dundas Street West, and Scarlett Road and St. Clair Avenue West
- Raised bikeways on Scarlett Road
- Multi-use trail on the north side of Dundas Street West, east and west of Scarlett Road
- New southbound left-turn lane from Scarlett Road to Dundas Street West
- New landscaping and public art
