CONSTRUCTION IMPACT Shendale Drive

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm and sanitary system in your area to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the construction work, there will be traffic impacts in your area. Shendale Drive will be closed from **7:00 A.M. on February 24, 2026, to 5:00 P.M. on May 29, 2026.**


This project is part of the Council-approved 2025 Basement Flooding Protection Program to improve the water distribution system, renew our aging infrastructure and reduce the risk of sewer collapse or blockages that cause sewer backups and flooding.

WORK DETAILS

The contractor will:

- Excavate on Shendale Drive to install the storm and sanitary sewer and allocate space on Shendale Drive for material storage during construction, followed by restoration of the area at a later date.
- This work will require the temporary **rolling road closure** of Shendale Drive to all traffic. Local and emergency access will be maintained.

Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users, and residents.

Traffic Detour:

- Shendale Drive will experience **rolling road closure** to all through traffic. Rolling closure will begin East of Norfield Crescent, and travel West along Shendale Drive, to North of Deeside Court.
- Traffic can exit East, to Albion Road via Shendale Drive, and North to Islington Avenue through Golfdown Drive, via Cove Drive.

Driveway Access:

During the road closure, residents will have access to their driveways except when construction is occurring in front of their property. Driveway Impact Notices will be distributed on an ongoing basis as necessary.

	When driveway access is not available, please park in a legal spot on a local side street and display the Driveway Impact Notice in your windshield.
	Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions; however, any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.
	Work Hours: Work will take place during the weekday from 7:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.
	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
