
F.G. Gardiner Expressway Bridge Repairs (over Bay Street and just east of Yonge Street)


The City of Toronto is carrying out concrete repairs to the F.G. Gardiner Expressway Bridge at Bay Street to just east of Yonge Street. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today’s standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future.

WORK DETAILS

The City’s contractor will:

- Repair the existing Bridge
- Reconstruct the concrete bents (i.e. columns and bent caps)
- Temporary lane marking and traffic control measures

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place between 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday. Overhead work over Lakeshore Boulevard West will be completed at night between 10:30 p.m. to 6 a.m., as required.</p> <p>Additional work after hours and on weekends may also be required.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: Grascan Construction LTD. / Stantec, under contract to the City of Toronto, is conducting inspections of properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment for the inspection.</p> <p>The inspection will look at the exterior and interior of properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all property owners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Traffic on Lake Shore Boulevard from Yonge Street to Raptors Way will be reduced to three lanes during the second stage of the project.</p>
	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
