## Basement Flooding Protection Program Fairbank-Silverthorn Storm Sewer System - Phase 2 Construction on Harvie Avenue, Chudleigh Road and Nairn Avenue

**Contract #: 23ECS-MI-03FS**

**Start Date: March 26, 2026**

**Expected End Date: August 2026\***

*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto is advancing construction of a new storm sewer system that will collect, store and move stormwater (rain and melted snow) from the Fairbank-Silverthorn area to Black Creek. This work is part of the City's Basement Flooding Protection Program to help reduce the risk of future basement flooding. Once complete, the new storm sewer system will help to reduce the impact of heavy rainfall and sewer back-ups for more than 4,600 homes in your area.

The City's contractor will be installing storm sewers on Harvie Avenue, Chudleigh Road and Nairn Avenue from March 2026 to August 2026. This work will begin once the [Rochdale Avenue and Ennerdale Road works](#) are completed. Once watermain related works are completed, road resurfacing and restoration will take place. The works will be done in the following phases:

- **Phase 1:** Starting from 424 Harvie Avenue to 436 Harvie Avenue
- **Phase 2:** Starting from 34 Chudleigh Road to 10 Chudleigh Road
- **Phase 3:** Starting from 381 Nairn Avenue to 351 Nairn Avenue.
- **Phase 4:** Road resurfacing and restoration works.

### The following traffic restrictions will apply during construction:

- Harvie Avenue will be limited to local traffic during construction. Driveways may be affected for short durations between #426 to #436 Harvie Avenue.
- Chudleigh Road will be limited to local traffic during construction. Driveways may be affected for short durations between #23 to #14 Chudleigh Road.
- Nairn Avenue will be limited to local traffic during construction. Driveways may be affected for short durations between #367 to #361 Nairn Avenue.
- One-way westbound traffic will be maintained at the Chudleigh/Nairn and Chudleigh/Harvie intersections.
- The east sidewalk between #337 Nairn Avenue to #440 Harvie Avenue will experience localized closures.
- The south sidewalk between #23 Chudleigh Road to #15 Chudleigh Road, and north sidewalk between #14 Chudleigh Road to #18 Chudleigh Road will experience localized closures.
- The west sidewalk between #373 Nairn Avenue to #351 Nairn Avenue, and east sidewalk between #359 Nairn Avenue to #369 Nairn Avenue will experience localized closures.

A separate driveway notice will be submitted to the above residences (if applicable) at least 48 hours before works take place. Pedestrian access to properties will be maintained at all times.

**Residents with parking permits can park anywhere within the 13L permitted area if you cannot find available parking due to construction activities (Refer to map on page 3).**

**Residents without parking permits can fill out the accompanying Parking Consideration Vehicle Intake Form along with the Parking Permit Application Notice. 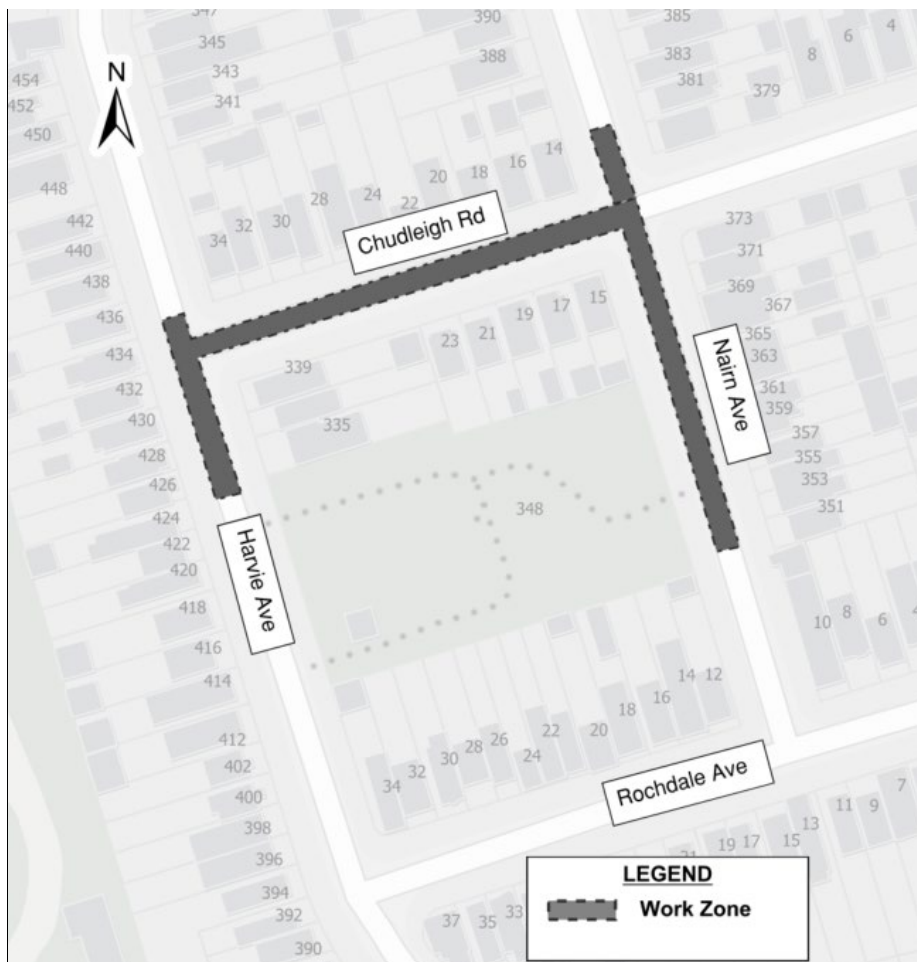
## WORK DETAILS

The contractor will:

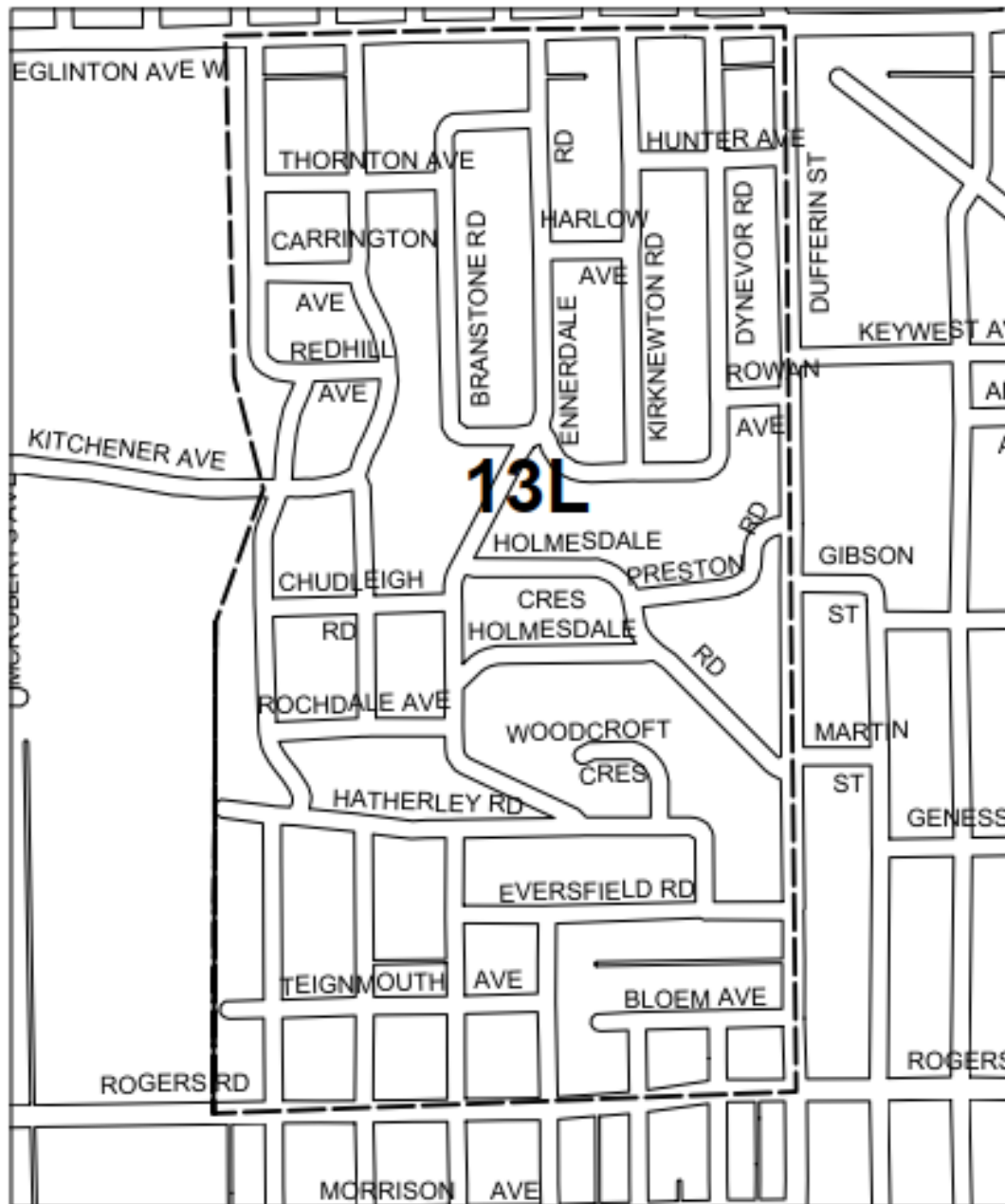
- Excavate the road and dig a trench.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property, so please ensure that you remove/arrange for removal of each item prior to construction.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p><b>On-Site Communication:</b> There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
	<p><b>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems/heated driveways and private landscaping features.</b> Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage. This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. For details on removal of such items, please contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Road Closure:</b> During construction, 381 Nairn Avenue to 351 Nairn Avenue will be closed and limited to local traffic only. Vehicular parking on Nairn Avenue will be prohibited during the working hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.</p> <p>Vehicles left unattended will be subject to “friendly towing.” Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Sidewalk Access:</b> Pedestrian access to properties will be maintained at all times. The west sidewalk on Nairn Avenue between #365 Nairn Avenue to #355 Nairn Avenue will experience localized closures. The east sidewalk on Nairn Avenue between #371 Nairn Avenue to #73 Chudleigh Avenue will also experience localized closures.</p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> Your driveway may be affected during the construction. Please note that you will be notified with a separate notice that specifies the duration of the driveway impact if applicable.</p> <p><b>Street Parking:</b> Street parking will not be available during construction. Arrangements for alternate streets should be considered.</p>

	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby side streets. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p>
	<p><b>Parking Violation Notices:</b> <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date in order to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Contact the Field Ambassador listed below, and provide a photo of your ticket and ticket number, along with your contact information.</li> <li><u>or</u></li> <li>2. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice)</li> <li><u>or</u></li> <li>3. File a Parking Violation Dispute online, by mail or in person (follow instructions on the back of the violation notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction</li> </ol> <p>If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.</p> <p><b>Please note:</b> Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e., in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).</p> <p>In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.</p>
	<p><b>Accessibility Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure that safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage and Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <b>Please ensure that your bins are labelled with your address.</b></p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Full restoration will be completed by the contractor.</p>
