## Sanitary forcemain replacement on your street

**Contract: 23TW-CTS-17CWD**

**Start Date: October 2025**

**End Date: December 2026**



**\*PLEASE HOLD ON TO THIS NOTICE FOR THE DURATION OF CONSTRUCTION\***

The City of Toronto will replace the sanitary forcemain (a pressurized sewer pipe that transports wastewater from a lower to higher elevation) that has reached the end of its life cycle. This project is part of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew aging infrastructure reducing the risk of forcemain breaks and collapses.

Work will take place on **Riverside Drive** from **Bloor Street West** to 100 m north of **Bloor Street West**, **Bloor Street West** from **Riverside Drive** to **Brule Terrace**, **Brule Terrace** from **Bloor Street West** to 20 m west of **Brule Gardens** and at the **Humber Sewage Pumping Station**. ### WORK DETAILS

In the first few weeks, the City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Construction crews will then:

- Incrementally excavate the road and dig a trench to install the new sanitary forcemains.
- Install the new forcemains.
- Work inside the pumping station, including checking and replacing equipment.
- When underground works are complete, restore the disturbed roadway areas with temporary asphalt and restore all the other disturbed areas such as the grassed area to its original condition.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The forcemain is located underground and is close to residential driveways. For specific properties, there will be impacts over a multi-day period to driveway access during work hours. If the work is happening in front of your driveway, you will receive a follow-up notice with more specific details on timing.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing a portion of driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.

- Property owners should remove items such as landscaping and/or decorative objects located within City property limits (boulevard). If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Field Ambassador (see contact information at the bottom of this notice).
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.
- If you are having work done on your property at the same time as the City will be doing work on public property in front of your house, please reach out to the Field Ambassador (see contact information below). Property owners are responsible for ensuring any contractors doing work on their own property do not interfere with the work being done on City property.
- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p><b>Work hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required and in accordance with the City's Noise Bylaw. Night work may be required as part of this project. You will be notified in advance of any changes to work hours.</p>
	<p><b>Construction noise:</b> You may experience intermittent noise and vibration during construction (from vacuum trucks, power generators, air compressors, etc.). All work will comply with the City of Toronto's Noise Bylaw.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October). Permanent restoration of the curb and sidewalk will take place within 18 to 24 months.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Road and sidewalk access:</b> To safely complete the work, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Driveway access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept accessible at all times.</p>
