## Overnight Sanitary Sewer Work on Scott Street from The Esplanade to Front Street East

**Contract: 24ECS-LU-03TT**

**Start: Monday, April 6, 2026 (7:00 p.m.)**

**End: Saturday, April 18, 2026 (7:00 a.m.)**

**Weekday nights only\***

The City of Toronto is providing an update regarding the ongoing Phase 2 sanitary sewer installation on Scott Street. To complete necessary utility works and accommodate the operational needs of local stakeholders, overnight work has been scheduled from **Monday, April 6, to Saturday, April 18.**

Starting at **7:00 p.m. on Monday, April 6**, and concluding at **7:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 18**, crews will continue constructing the shaft structure and associated utility works on the west side of Scott Street, north of The Esplanade. During this time, daytime activities will be restricted to light-duty preparation works to reduce the impact on the local community.

Regular work hours will resume immediately following the completion of this overnight phase. Please note that the project schedule is subject to change based on weather conditions. The contractor will make every effort to minimize noise and disruptions to residents and businesses, and we sincerely appreciate your continued patience and understanding throughout these essential infrastructure improvements.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION



- Heavy equipment will be operated during the overnight construction period, and you may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. We will be implementing dust-control measures and noise-reduction efforts to keep disruptions to a minimum.
- Crews require temporary lighting for nighttime shaft work.
- Please note that all construction vehicles are equipped with mandatory backup warning/signalling beepers. These devices are required for the safety of construction crews and cannot be disabled.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property, so please ensure that you remove/arrange for the removal of such items.



**Road and Sidewalk Access:** To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be some road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

**Driveway Access:** The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to driveway access. This overnight work will allow the contractor to cross both Scott Street lanes and the underground parking garage in one operation, minimizing impacts to local stakeholders.

# Notice of Overnight Work

	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Traffic on Scott Street has been reduced to one north-bound lane from The Esplanade to Front Street East to accommodate for this project. There is no on-street parking permitted on Scott Street during the construction period. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the same traffic lane. When driving, please be mindful of other road users.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.</p>
