Road Reconstruction on Greenwood Avenue from Mortimer Avenue to Strathmore Boulevard

Contract: 25ECS-RD-06MR

Start Date: March 2026 Expected End Date: July 2026

**Timeline is subject to change.*

This notice provides an update on the road reconstruction and substandard water services replacements on Greenwood Avenue between Mortimer Avenue and Strathmore Boulevard.

Phase 1 of construction, which included the replacement of the watermain, has been completed. The project is now moving into Phase 2, which will involve full road reconstruction and accessibility upgrades designed to shorten crossing distances, reduce turning speeds, and enhance visibility between drivers and pedestrians.

Phase 2 will be carried out in multiple stages. Not all stages will require full lane closures; however, closures will be in effect during the following stages and within the specified limits:

- **Stage 1 (March 30 to April 2):** Mortimer Avenue to Sammon Avenue
- **Stage 2 (April 7 to April 10):** Sammon Avenue to Milverton Boulevard
- **Stage 3 (April 11 to April 14):** Milverton Boulevard to Glebeholme Boulevard
- **Stage 4 (April 15 to April 20):** Glebeholme Boulevard to Strathmore Boulevard

Please note that all construction work and road closure dates are weather-dependent and may be subject to change.

Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.

Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.

Residents whose driveways will be impacted will be notified and provided temporary parking.

WORK STATUS TO DATE

The City's contractor has:

- Completed replacement of all substandard water services
- Replaced and/or adjusted damaged sidewalks, curbs and gutters, driveways, subdrains, and restored boulevards (including topsoil and sod) on both sides of the road
- Reduced curb radii at all corners of Greenwood Avenue at Queensdale Avenue, Springdale Avenue, Milverton Boulevard, and Glebeholme Boulevard







REMAINING WORK

Work crews will do:

- Remove and replace the existing asphalt of the roadway
- Crosswalk construction at east & west side of Glebeholme Boulevard and Milverton Boulevard, and on the east side of Springdale Boulevard
- Installation of newly marked pedestrian crossings and accessibility upgrades at all intersections
- Placement of new pavement markings on the roadway

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions, however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.</p>
	<p>Parking: This project will affect on-street and driveway parking. Parking permits will be distributed to affected residents prior to the work commencing. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.</p>
	<p>Parking Violation Notice: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. <p>If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.</p> <p>Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (e.g. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).</p> <p>In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon</p>

as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
