Watermain Replacement and Road Reconstruction on Scarborough Golf Club Road from Ellesmere Road to Lawrence Avenue East

Contract: 24ECS-RD-02MR

Start Date: April 20, 2026 NEW End Date: late-July 2026

This notice provides an update on the City of Toronto's ongoing road improvements on Scarborough Golf Club Road from Ellesmere Road to Lawrence Avenue East.

The City's contractor has completed the watermain replacement and the construction of wider sidewalks along Scarborough Golf Club Road. Starting April 20, the contractor will return to complete all remaining road reconstruction activities.

Construction will be carried out in phases to help minimize impacts to traffic.

- **Phase 1: April 20 to late May 2026**
Traffic will be reduced to one northbound lane only between Ellesmere Road and Brimorton Drive. Once work in Phase 1 is complete, all travel lanes within the section will reopen
- **Phase 2: early June until late July 2026**
Traffic will be reduced to one northbound lane only between Lawrence Avenue East and Brimorton Drive.

Local access to side streets located on the east and west sides will be maintained from Scarborough Golf Club Road.

The City and its contractor will use a number of measures to help manage traffic flow in the area, including modifying signal timing, electronic message boards, traffic agents and paid duty officers. Signs will be posted ahead of the construction zone to direct drivers and cyclists.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2024 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalks for current and future needs.

WORK STATUS TO DATE

Since this project started in spring 2025, the contractor has completed the following work:

- Replaced the watermain and substandard water services
- Constructed curbs and gutters
- Removed existing sidewalks and constructed wider sidewalks
- Constructed raised TTC bus platforms
- Reconstructed the road and placed the base asphalt







REMAINING WORK

The contractor will:

- Continue installing the new bike lanes (cycle tracks) and separation curbs on both the east and west side
- Complete raised crosswalks on the east side at Greenock Avenue and Newark Road and west side at Chandler Drive and Painted Post Drive
- Complete protected intersections at Lawrence Avenue East and Ellesmere Road
- Complete installation of the permanent traffic signal poles
- Complete bioretention planters and green gutters on the east and west side
- Place top asphalt and restore all boulevards and other areas impacted by construction

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.</p>
	<p>Parking Violation Notice: <u>Please ensure you park in a legal parking spot at all times.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) or 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. <p>If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.</p> <p>Please note: Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (e.g. in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).</p> <p>In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
