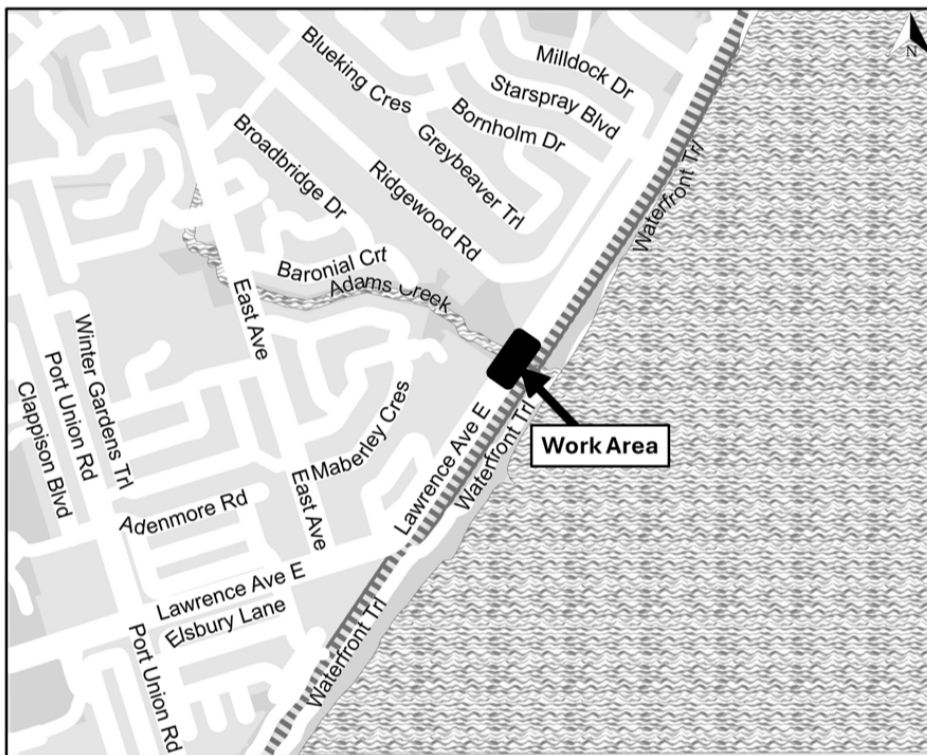
Lawrence Avenue Culvert Rehabilitation over Adams Creek

Contract: 25ECS-BE-10PM
New Start Date: Summer 2026 End Date: Winter 2026
**Timeline is subject to change.*

This notice provides an update on the rehabilitation of Lawrence Avenue Culvert over Adams Creek.

Due to delays in third party reviews, work on this project has been pushed back from the original start date of Winter 2025/2026 and construction will now begin in **Summer 2026**. An additional construction notice will be distributed to nearby community a few weeks before work begins.



MAP OF WORK AREA & WORK DETAILS



- The City's contractor will:
- Repair and renovate the existing Lawrence Avenue Culvert over Adams Creek.
 - Complete concrete repairs to the existing culvert structure
 - Remove and replace wooden steel beam guardrail posts
 - Remove and replace chain link barrier fence
 - Remove and install new concrete on top of existing headwalls and retaining walls
 - Remove sediment and vegetation build up through the culvert barrel and at inlet and outlet

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vehicular traffic on Lawrence Road will be maintained with one lane in each direction. • Sidewalk on both sides of Lawrence Road will remain open throughout construction.

	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
