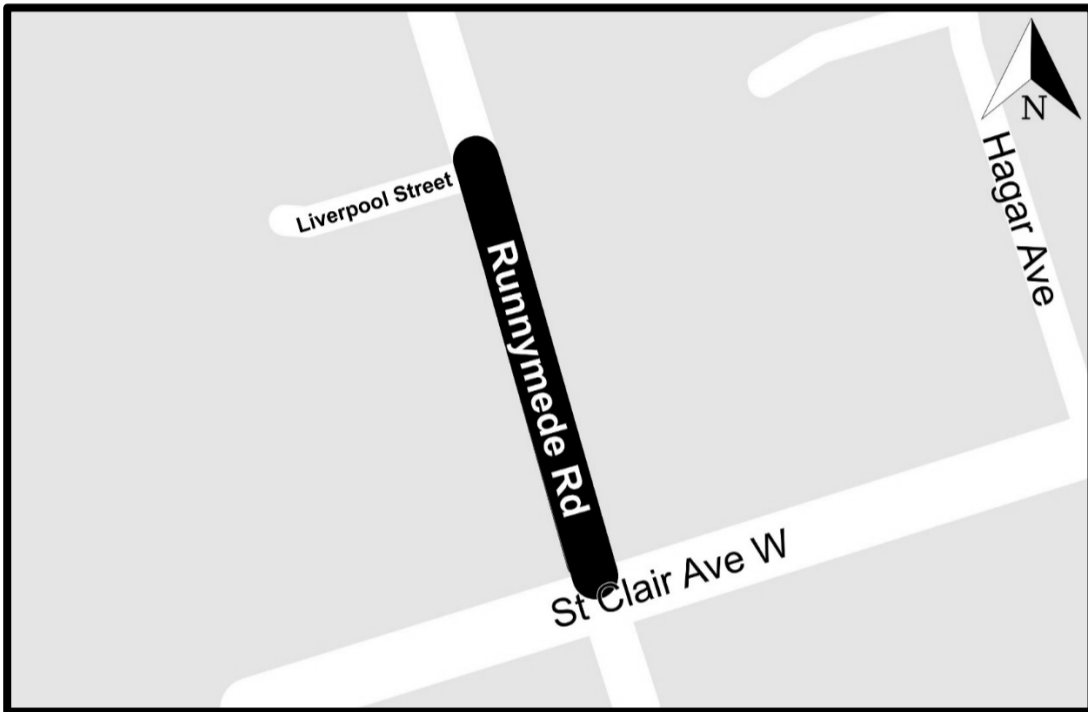
## Local Road Resurfacing on Runnymede Road

**Contract: 25ECS-RD-04RR**  
**Start Date: Spring 2026 || End Date: Fall 2026**  
*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto is planning to resurface the road on Runnymede Road from Liverpool Street to St. Clair Avenue West. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs resurfacing, and the curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.



This project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

### WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Access to Your Home:</b> The City-hired contractor may need access to the interior and exterior of your home to complete a pre-construction condition survey. Affected properties will receive a request to schedule a time to complete the pre-construction condition survey. Although participation is voluntary, the pre-construction survey results may be useful to confirm claims for potential damage caused by City construction.</p>

	<p><b>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features.</b> Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the <b>Field Ambassador</b> listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Asbestos in Asphalt on Runnymede Road:</b> As part of the work, the City must test the removed asphalt for asbestos. Our tests show that there is asbestos in the asphalt on Runnymede Road.</p> <p>Asbestos was used in asphalt mixes throughout the 1970s and early 1980s to improve the performance of the asphalt. Air quality monitoring conducted by the City of Toronto at other sites has not detected asbestos fibres in the air as a result of resurfacing asphalt. The risk of exposure to asbestos for workers and bystanders is low.</p> <p><b>As a precaution, the City requires the contractor to follow these steps:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wet the pavement during asphalt cutting, grinding or removal,</li> <li>• Attach dust collecting devices with HEPA filters to equipment, where possible, to prevent dust from becoming airborne,</li> <li>• Provide personal protective equipment (disposable coveralls and respirators) to on-site workers, and</li> <li>• Transport and dispose of asphalt containing asbestos to provincially approved disposal sites.</li> </ul>
