Laneway Reconstruction on Habibi Laneway and Lane North Norman West Caledonia

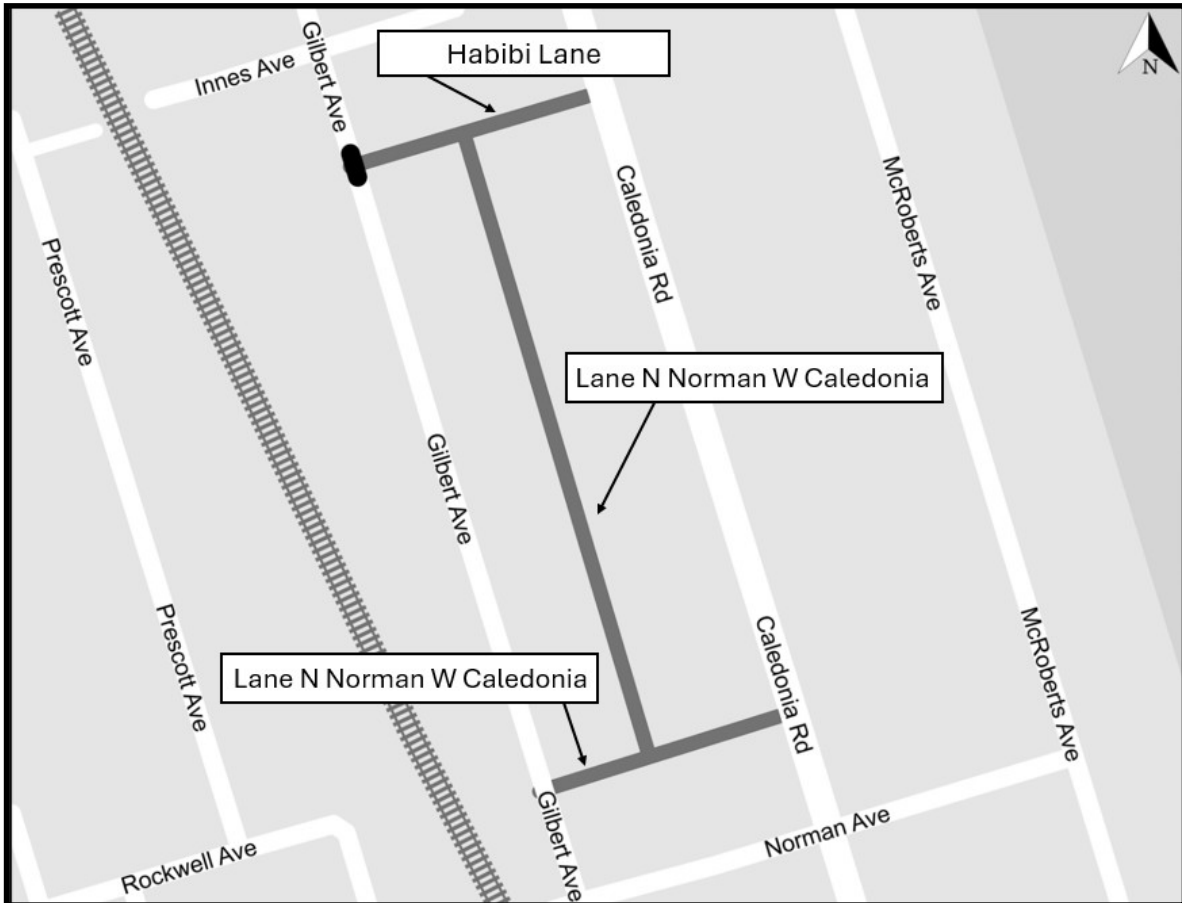
The City of Toronto is planning laneway reconstruction and streetscape improvements on Habibi Laneway, and Lane North Norman West Caledonia from Caledonia Road to Gilbert Avenue, and Lane North Norman West Caledonia from Habibi Laneway to Lane North Norman West Caledonia.

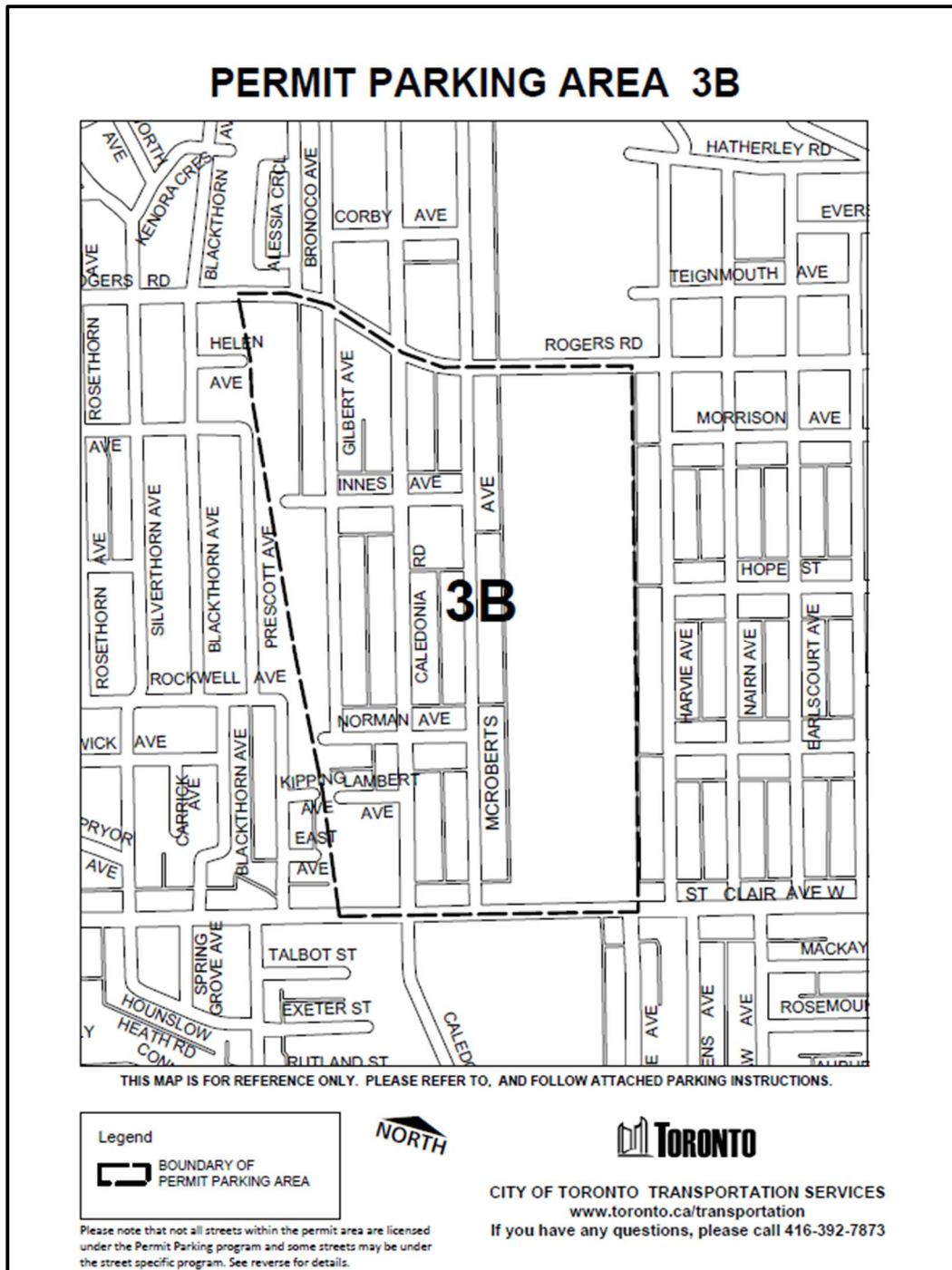
Our inspection of the road shows that it needs reconstruction, and the curbs need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

During construction, residents with parking permits can park anywhere within the 3B permitted area if you cannot find available parking due to construction activities (Refer to map on page 2). Residents without parking permits can submit a request for a parking permit to the Field Ambassador, who will contact you to process your request.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2026 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Parking: Construction activities near Caledonia Road and Gilbert Avenue will result in temporary parking displacements on adjacent streets. Residents who hold a 3B parking permit may park anywhere within the designated 3B permitted area if construction prevents them from finding a space in their usual location, as shown on the map on page 2. Residents without permits who are affected by the work should coordinate directly with the Field Ambassador to arrange for alternate parking solutions. While every effort will be made to provide replacement spaces</p>

	<p>near your current location, exact proximity cannot be guaranteed due to site constraints.</p> <p>Parking within the active work zone is strictly prohibited, as this space is required for construction equipment and materials. If you do not currently have a permit but require one for the duration of the project, please reach out to the Field Ambassador. Please be aware that temporary permits will not be available until the construction start date approaches. Further details regarding specific parking impacts will be provided in a future construction notice.</p>
	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
