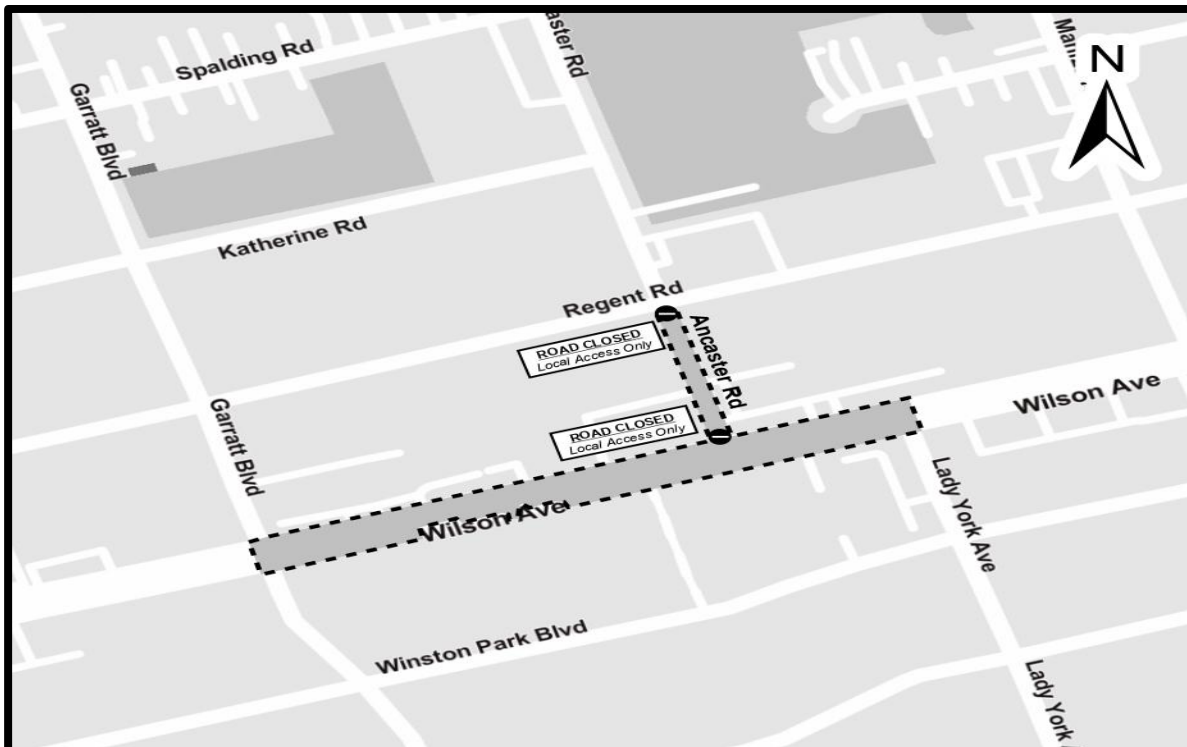

This notice provides an update on permanent road and sidewalk restoration on Wilson Avenue between Garratt Boulevard and Lady York Avenue. Crews will be restoring areas previously impacted by construction on Wilson Avenue and adjacent sidewalks. As part of this work, there will be lane closures and impacts to sidewalk access.

The City will make effort to expedite restoration of the affected infrastructure on the road and sidewalks, ensuring all traffic lanes are reopened as quickly as possible before **May 23, 2026**. If any restoration work remains to be completed by the end of May 2026, it will be completed in July 2026, during a period when no concerts are scheduled at Rogers Stadium, to minimize disruption. **The lane closures will occur from 7 a.m. on Monday, April 13, 2026, until 7 p.m. on Friday, July 31, 2026 (as required).**

WORK STATUS

The City's contractor will:

- Complete road and sidewalk restoration along Wilson Avenue from Garratt Boulevard to Lady York Avenue, where basement flooding construction occurred.
- Allocate space on Ancaster Road for material storage during construction.
- This work will require a temporary closure of Ancaster Road to through traffic; however, local access will be maintained.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- There will be sidewalk and roadway lane closures, however, access to businesses will be maintained
- You may experience dust, noise, and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Extended hours during weekdays and weekends may be required to maintain the schedule</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users, and residents. Traffic on Wilson Avenue will be reduced to one lane. Ancaster Road will be closed to through traffic but open to residents.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be always maintained.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be always kept open.</p>
	<p>Pedestrians: The work will require temporary sidewalk restrictions; however, any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.</p>
	<p>Parking: This project affects on-street parking on Ancaster Road. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.</p>
	<p>Parking Violation Notices: <u>Please ensure that you always park in a legal parking spot.</u> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the yellow ticket) 2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City, online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the yellow ticket). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction. <p>Please note: Parking violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (e.g., in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
