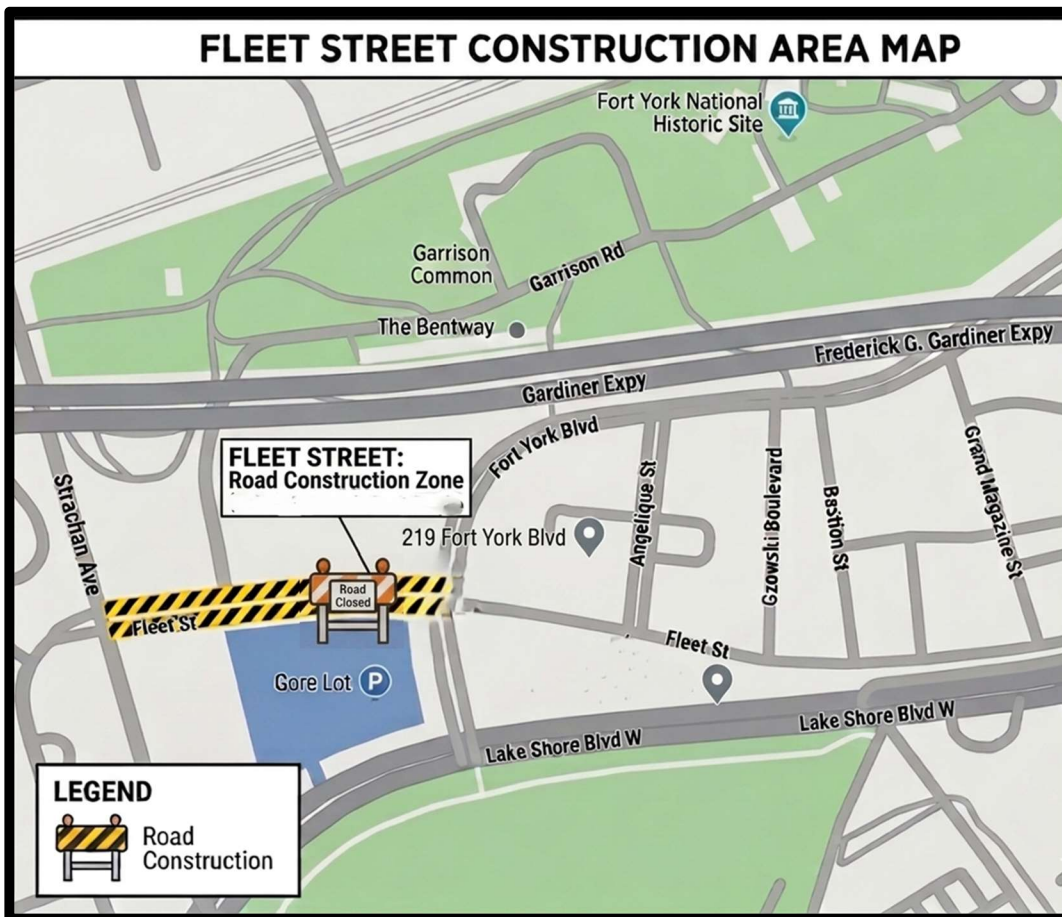
FLEET STREET CLOSURE FOR TEMPORARY TRANSIT HUB

Contract: 26ECS-RD-101SW
Installation Start Date: May 18, 2026 | End Date: June 5, 2026
Removal Start Date: July 25, 2026 | End Date: July 31, 2026

Fleet Street will be closed beginning Monday, May 18, for the construction and operation of temporary transit infrastructure improvements in support of the upcoming FIFA World Cup 2026™ Toronto, including improved access to Toronto Stadium and FIFA Fan Festival™.

The Fleet Street transit hub will run from Strachan Avenue to Fort York Boulevard and include dedicated queuing and boarding areas to help manage crowd volumes. It is part of ongoing work by the City and TTC to improve transit capacity, accessibility and safety, and will play a key role in moving large numbers of people during the FIFA World Cup 2026™ in Toronto.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Sunday.</p>
	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with local stakeholders about what is happening on-site. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector.</p>
 	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area. Access to businesses will be maintained.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Laneways: Laneways and driveways that serve businesses in the area will remain accessible for deliveries or service. Please note Gore Lot east driveway will be closed from May 18 to July 31.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Motorists are reminded to abide by traffic/construction signs posted in local areas to ensure the safe travel of all local road users, pedestrians and cyclists. Efforts will be made to manage traffic and closures in the area for the safety of workers.</p>
	<p>Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials.</p>
	<p>TTC service: While the Fleet Street streetcar platform work will not impact 509 Harbourfront or 511 Bathurst streetcar service, northbound 307 Bathurst Night buses began diverting via Strachan Avenue and Lake Shore Boulevard West to Fort York Boulevard as of May 3, 2026. 	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please contact the City contact listed below.</p>
	<p>Cyclists: During construction the road will be Signed detours will be in place around the work zone.</p>
