Weekend Sanitary Sewer Work on Scott Street from The Esplanade to Front Street East

Contract: 24ECS-LU-03TT
Start: Saturday, May 23, 2026 (7:00 a.m.)
End: Sunday, May 24, 2026 (7:00 p.m.)
Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is providing an update regarding the ongoing Phase 2 sanitary sewer installation on Scott Street. Major components of the sanitary sewer upgrade have now been completed, and current efforts are focused on completing the final sanitary sewer connection and associated restoration activities.

Extended hours construction activities are scheduled for the weekend of **Saturday, May 23, 2026**, and **Sunday, May 24, 2026**. Work will take place daily from approximately **7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.** to support final restoration activities and overall project completion efforts.

Following completion of this weekend work period, crews will return to regular daytime working hours to complete the remaining restoration work on the Scott Street, just north of The Esplanade.

Please be advised that the project schedule remains subject to change due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances. The contractor will make every reasonable effort to minimize noise, maintain accessibility, and reduce disruptions to nearby residents, businesses, pedestrians, and road users.

We sincerely appreciate your continued patience, understanding, and cooperation as these essential infrastructure improvements are completed.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION



- Heavy equipment will be operated during the weekend construction period, and you may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. We will be implementing dust-control measures and noise-reduction efforts to keep disruptions to a minimum.
- Please note that all construction vehicles are equipped with mandatory backup warning/signalling beepers. These devices are required for the safety of construction crews and cannot be disabled.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property, so please ensure that you remove/arrange for the removal of such items.



Road and Sidewalk Access: To complete the work in a safe manner, there will be some road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to driveway access. This overnight work will allow the contractor to cross both Scott

|  | Traffic Management: Traffic on Scott Street has been reduced to one north-bound lane from The Esplanade to Front Street East to accommodate for this project. There is no on-street parking permitted on Scott Street during the construction period. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the same traffic lane. When driving, please be mindful of other road users. |
