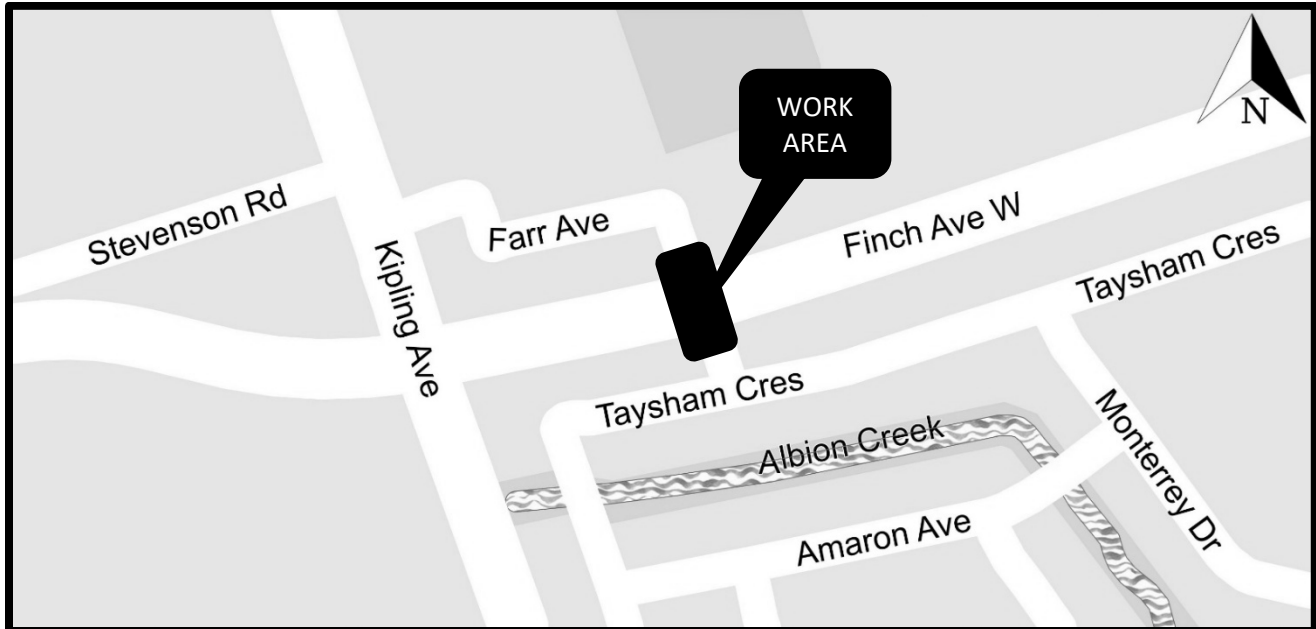

The City of Toronto recently completed rehabilitation of the Finch Avenue West Pedestrian Bridge at Farr Avenue. The majority of the remaining City work over the Finch West LRT corridor will be completed in coordination with Metrolinx's multi-day service closure of Line 6 Finch West over the Victoria Day long-weekend, with the remaining activities expected to be completed within three (3) weeks.

This work will involve lifting the bridge to replace the bearings, replacing the existing handrails, and recoating the structural steel. Some activities may take place overnight. We appreciate your patience as we complete this important work.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, and 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Saturdays, with occasional overnight and early morning Sunday work, as required..</p>
	<p>Bridge Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, access to the pedestrian bridge may be closed intermittently for the duration of construction work. Pedestrian traffic will be rerouted to cross Finch Avenue approximately 200 metres west of the bridge towards Kipling Avenue.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on Finch Avenue West at Farr Avenue. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p>Single-lane closures will be required on Finch Avenue West at Farr Avenue, affecting both directions.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
