

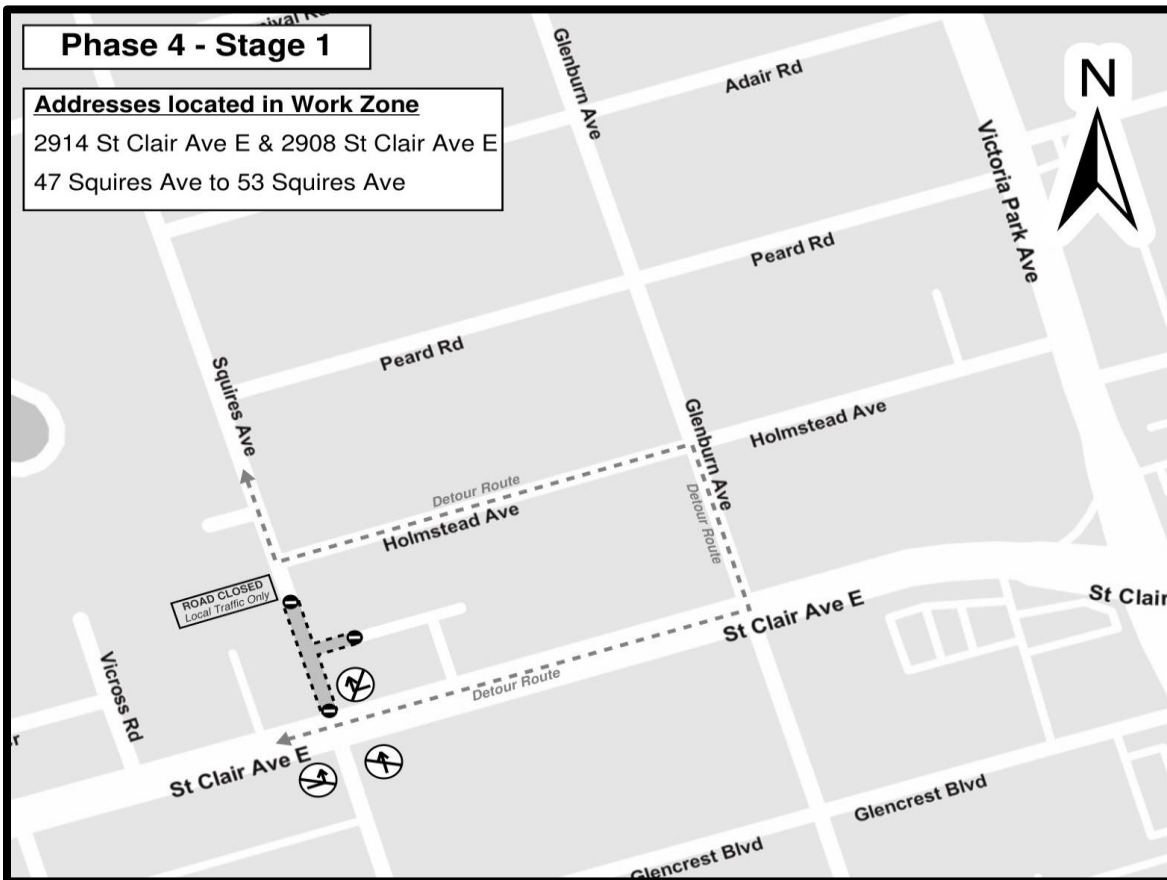

## Storm Sewer Upgrade on Squires Avenue

Contract 23ECS-LU-03FP  
Start Date: May 27, 2026  
Expected End Date: July 31, 2026  
\*Content/dates subject to change

The City of Toronto is upgrading the storm sewer system along a portion of Squires Avenue to reduce surface and basement flooding. Due to the depth and nature of the construction work, Squires Avenue will be closed just north of the intersection at St Clair Avenue East and Squires Avenue. This temporary road closure will be in effect from 7:00 a.m., Wednesday, May 27, 2026, until 7:00 p.m., Friday, July 31, 2026.

## WORK DETAILS

The contractor will:

- Upgrade the storm sewer system to reduce surface and basement flooding.
- Excavate at the intersection of St Clair Avenue East and Squires Avenue.
- Addresses located within the work zone include: **2908 St Clair Avenue East, 2914 St Clair Avenue East, and 47 Squires Avenue to 53 Squires Avenue.**
- The work area will be closed to all through traffic from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Friday. Local road access and driveway access will be available to residents within the work zone after 7 p.m.
- During construction, driveways may be affected for varying periods of time. If a driveway closure is required, the contractor will distribute Driveway Impact Notices to the affected addresses when necessary.
- When driveway access is impacted, please park in a legal spot on a local side street i.e., Adair Avenue, Furnival Road, Glenburn Avenue, or Holmstead Avenue and display the Driveway Impact Notice on your windshield.

	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users, and residents.</p> <p><b>Traffic Detour:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Northbound traffic to travel east on St Clair Avenue East, take Glenburn Avenue to Holmstead Avenue. Continue west on Holmstead Avenue to Squires Avenue.</li> <li>• Southbound traffic to travel east on Holmstead Avenue, then take Glenburn Avenue to St Clair Avenue East. Continue west on St Clair Avenue East.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Pedestrians:</b> Sidewalks will be fully accessible on both sides of the street.</p>
	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>



**Parking Violation Notices: Please ensure you always park in a legal parking spot.** If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, please do one of the following within 15 days of the notice date to avoid additional fines or records being kept of non-payment:

1. Pay the parking violation (follow instructions on the back of the notice) **or**
2. File a Parking Violation Dispute with the City online, by mail, or in person (follow instructions on the back of the notice). As part of the dispute process, you may include the construction notice and/or other documentation related to parking impacts resulting from construction.


If you do not have a copy of the Construction Notice, please contact 311 to request a copy.

**Please note:** Violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e., in front of a fire hydrant or in No Parking zones).

To reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction impacts and may need to temporarily park on your street.
