Governor's Road Bridge Rehabilitation over Moore Park Ravine

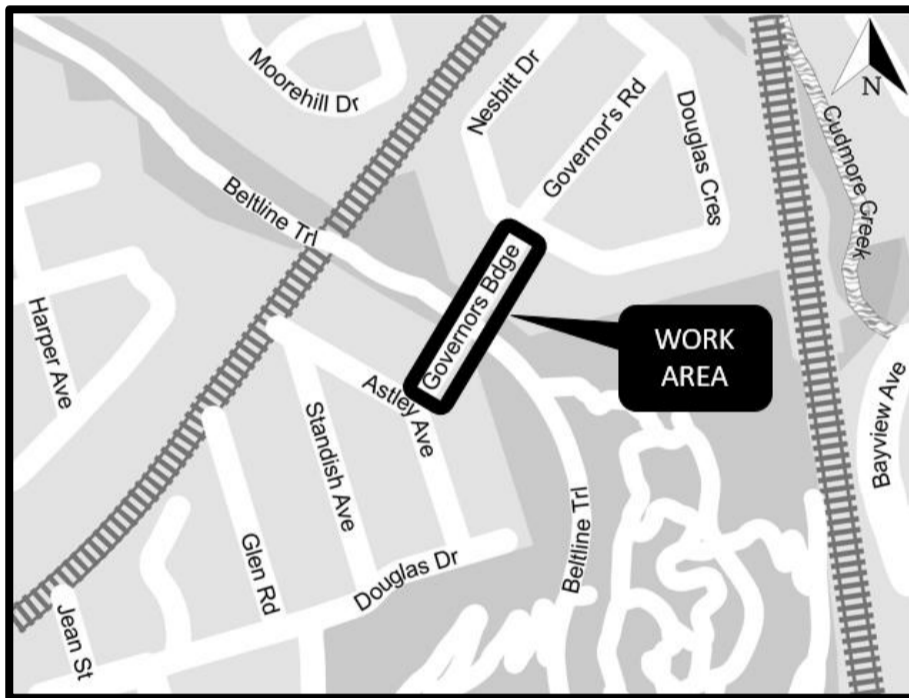

The City of Toronto is rehabilitating the Governor's Road Bridge over Moore Park Ravine. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe into the future.

The project completion date for this work has been extended to Fall 2026 due to additional safety requirements and challenges of working on the bridge's narrow deck and in hard to access areas.

To safely carry out repairs on the deck surface and parapet walls, the bridge will be fully closed to non-emergency vehicular traffic for five weeks, starting on July 6, 2026. During this time, one sidewalk will remain open for pedestrian access.

WORK COMPLETED

To date, the City's contractor has completed:

- Repairs and/ or refacing the bridge piers, abutments, soffit, and wing walls.






WORK TO BE COMPLETED

- Patch the concrete sidewalks, parapet walls, deck, and approach slab.
- Continue with arch soffit refacing.
- Replace the asphalt surface, waterproofing, and lighting fixtures.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturdays. No work will occur on Sundays and Statutory holidays.</p>

	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>At least one sidewalk will always remain open at all times. Temporary signage will direct pedestrians to cross the bridge safely.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p>The bridge will be closed to public traffic for five weeks starting July 6, 2026. The public will be notified in advance about the upcoming closure through posted signs.</p> <p>One sidewalk will be closed for material storage and repair activities during this project.</p> <hr/> <p>Turn Restrictions and Nesbitt Drive/Bayview Avenue</p> <p>The current turn restrictions at Nesbitt and Bayview will be temporarily lifted during the full bridge closure. They will be reinstated once the bridge is reopened during construction and will remain in place after construction is complete.</p>
	<p>On-Site Communication: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility company branded clothing. If you need to speak with staff on the construction site, please ask for the Site Inspector</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Field Ambassador listed below.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
