Shelter Operations

Christie Ossington Neighbourhood Centre (CONC), the shelter operator, has been providing essential support to vulnerable communities since 1993. CONC currently operates:

- 4 shelters
- 1 drop-in centre
- 1 community centre
- 1 transitional housing program
- 1 winter warming centre

CONC's goal for the 66 Third Street shelter for seniors is to support clients with dignity and respect as they gain stability, reduce social isolation and transition to permanent housing. Last year, CONC provided an average of 288 shelter beds per night across its 4 permanent shelters and placed 98 clients in permanent housing.

The team at CONC is proud of the programs and shelters they operate and has invited everyone interested in learning about the future operations of 66 Third Street senior's shelter to join a facility tour of one of their existing shelter sites.

Design and Operational Planning for Seniors

66 Third is being intentionally designed and programmed to support seniors.

- Only clients aged 55+ will be referred to the new shelter through the City's Central Intake service www.toronto.ca/central-intake.
- The rooms and programs within the shelter are being designed specifically for seniors, including accessible spaces, counselling and other supports.
- About a year before the shelter opens, CONC and the City will share more details about anticipated on-site operations, which are currently in early development.

Construction Updates

Pre-construction preparation is scheduled to begin in early Summer 2026.

Construction Work Hours

Construction noise expected during the following hours:

- **Monday to Friday:** 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- **Saturdays:** 9 a.m. to 7 p.m.

What You Might See on Site

The former parking lot was permanently closed on March 31, 2026. Nearby available municipal parking lots:

- Carpark 506- 120 Sixth Street
- Carpark 509-140 Fifth Street

Residents may observe construction activity, including:

- **Hoarding (Plywood Barriers):** The City will be installing informational signage.
- **Minor works:** The wooden rails and curbs within the site boundary will be removed.
- **Workers & Vehicles:** Ongoing presence of workers and construction vehicles, equipment operation and material deliveries.
- **Arborists** will be on site to assess existing trees and provide a Tree Protection Plan.

How Construction Impacts Will Be Managed

Mitigation measures are in place to reduce disruptions, including:

- On-site supervision
- Adherence to municipal by-laws and provincial regulations
- Use of appropriate shielding and equipment to minimize noise
